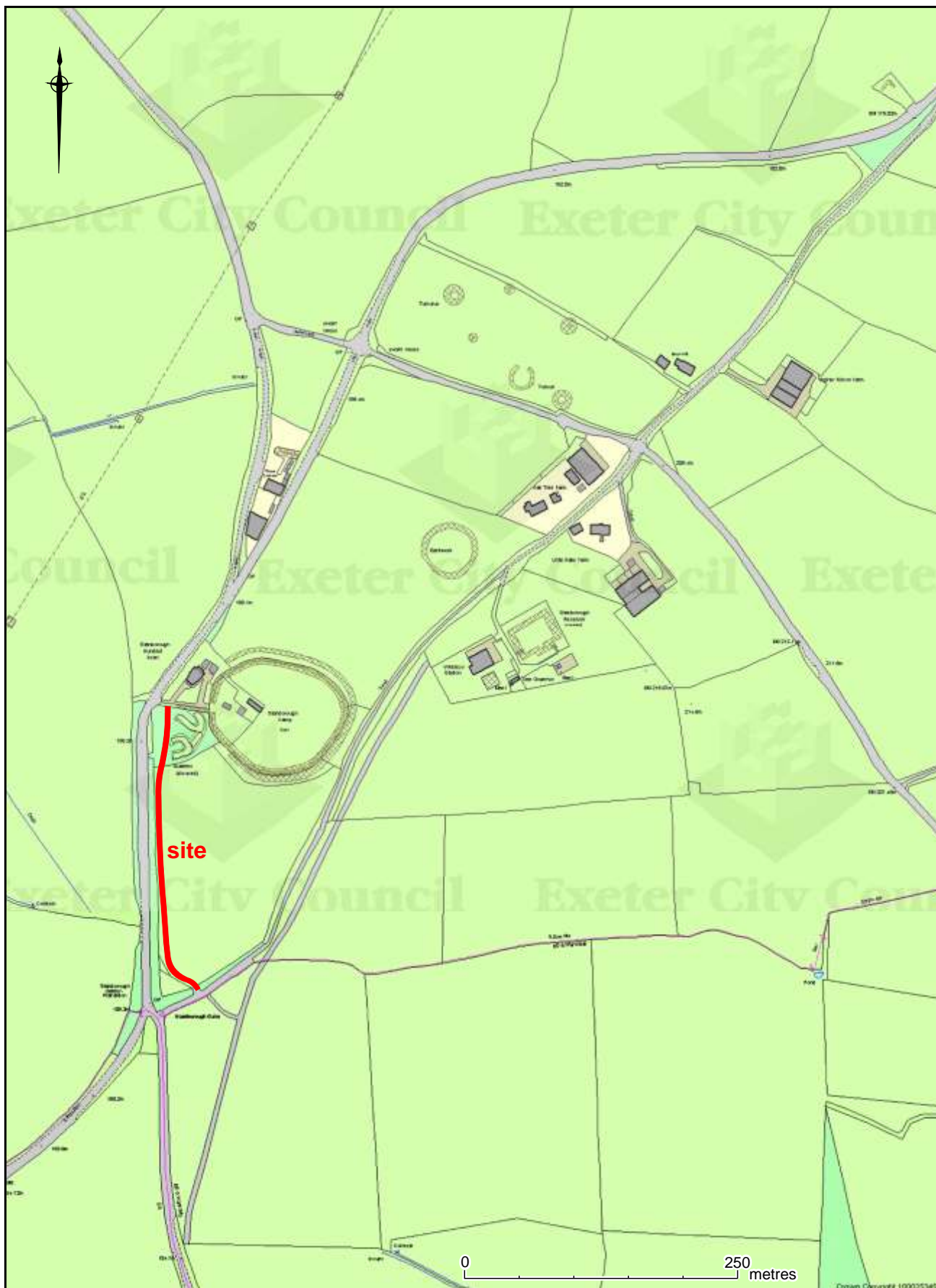

Subject: Archaeological Watching brief at Stanborough Hundred, Moreleigh, Totnes, Devon, TQ9 7JG.		
Description: <p>Groundworks for the construction of a new access drive were monitored and recorded. The monitored area (see attached plan) lies immediately to the southwest of Stanborough Camp, a Scheduled Monument (SM 33746), and also close to the position of a former banked and ditched enclosure, now levelled by ploughing, which previously included a standing stone known as the 'Old Man'.</p> <p>The development area (100m long x 4m wide) ran parallel with the A381 (see plan). It crossed a disused quarry at its northern end. This had been partially infilled during the 20th century to level the area for the garden. Topsoil overlying the backfilled quarry was between 0.05-0.10m thick</p> <p>Ground level reductions across the area to the south of the quarry were too shallow to expose the underlying natural subsoil.</p> <p>Depths of between 0.2m and 0.3m of topsoil were removed from the field south of the quarry. Underlying subsoil was only occasionally exposed.</p> <p>No archaeological features were exposed, and no finds were recovered.</p>	Ref: EA project 6143	Date: 22/08-23/08/07
