## **Description of works:**

The site lies within an area of known archaeological activity. On the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century OS maps the development area is shown as being the site of Woolacombe Tracey, a medieval mansion. It was therefore considered possible that associated artefacts or deposits of medieval date may survive within the footprint of the development.

The site area measured approximately 20m by 15m (see attached plan). An archaeologist was present during all groundworks, which extended to a maximum depth of 1m.

## **Results:**

The layer sequence revealed by topsoil removal typically consisted of the following:

0-400mm - Topsoil

4-700mm - Subsoil

700mm + - Shale (natural subsoil)

No archaeological features, deposits or artefacts were found.




Fig. 1 Location of site. Reproduced from the Ordnance Survey® mapping (1:10000 and 1:75000) with the permission of The Controller of Her Majesty's Stationery Office. © Crown copyright. Exeter City Council 100025345.




Fig. 2 Plan of site. Reproduced from the Ordnance Survey® mapping (1:500) with the permission of The Controller of Her Majesty's Stationery Office. © Crown copyright. Exeter City Council 100025345.
