

Description of works.				
Archaeological monitoring and recording was carried during ground reduction prior to the erection of an agricultural livestock building. The site area measured approx 25m by 30m				
The site lies in an area of archaeological potential as demonstrated by aerial photography, which has identified settlement sites and funerary monuments to the north of the development site. Additionally, find spots of flint tools are recorded in the HER in the proximity of the development area.				
Topsoil was machine-removed across the site to expose underlying subsoil at a depth of approximately 200mm below ground level. A single feature was exposed; a small oval pit [1003], located in the northeast of the site. It measured 610mm long, 540mm wide and 230mm deep. It was filled with reddish brown silty clay which contained a single fragment of animal bone. The feature most-probably represents a post medieval rubbish pit.				
The topsoil produced a small number of 19 th and 20 th century pot sherds. No flints or other artefacts were found.
