

| Description of works.   |   |  |         |              |
| Archaeological monitoring and recording was undertaken during topsoil removal and reduction of ground levels in advance of the construction of a new agricultural building.  The proposed development lies some 2.5km to the SW of Tavistock within a field demarcated to the south by a Forestry Commission trackway and to the west and north by Birch Wood (fig. 1). Immediately to the south lies the site of the now disused 19th-century Devon and Courtenay Mine. The site is positioned on fairly flat land at an average height of c.125m AOD.  Initial works involved the reduction of ground within the footprint of the development including the associated driveway (c.327m²) to a maximum depth of 0.20m. Weathered natural subsoil was exposed throughout the development area. This was sealed by topsoil consisting of a mid brown clayey silt.  No significant archaeological deposits or features were exposed during the reduction and no pottery or other artefacts were recovered. |   |  |         |              |
