

Description of works. A watching brief was undertaken by Exeter Archaeology on groundworks for a development at The Cleave, Lynton to fulfil condition No.11 of planning permission required by Exmoor National Park Authority (ENPA). The development was in the central south-eastern part of the site, at the end of Baker's Court Lane. The site lay near the base of a steep south-eastern facing hillside and the works involved the construction of a deep terrace for the building and yard and the consolidation of the hillside above, which consisted of fractured and unstable stone. Rows of gabions (baskets: rubble filled iron cages) were set into terraces along the contours to support the hillside. There was a large quantity of loose stone and clay by the wall at the south-east end of the site that was interpreted as modern spoil, possibly from earlier groundworks. The stratigraphy consisted of topsoil and turf to a depth of circa 0.3m, overlying in situ stone and clay. No features of archaeological significance were observed or pre-19 th -century finds recovered.
