Addendum

Two further watching brief visits were made to the site at Mill Garage, Bexley in May 2011, to monitor areas to the north of the site, especially that along the street frontage (Figure 1).

Watching Brief Visit 6th May 2011

This visit monitored the excavation of an area measuring approximately 15 m by 15 m at the north of the site. This area was excavated to a depth of approximately 1.7 m. Some parts of the area were truncated by petrol tanks and as such were contaminated by petrochemicals. The stratigraphy observed during these works matched that of the previous phase of watching brief and is summarised below:

Watching Brief Visit Saturday 21st May 2011

This final visit monitored the excavation of the area by the main entrance to the site, measuring approximately 15m by 5m. This area was considered high potential due to its position along the medieval street frontage. Due to reasons of health and safety, the excavation was battered back to the north-east (adjacent to the gate) and north-west (adjacent to the railway bridge). As such, an measuring approximately 5m by 5m was excavated down to the level of the river gravels.

The depth of the excavation varied from 1.5 m to 1.8 m. While there was little contaminated ground exposed during the excavation although it did appear that the western side of the excavation had been truncated and replaced by made ground, as there was no sign of the peaty clay layer visible in this area. This may have been related to the construction of the railway bridge to the north. A layer of concrete slab (004) directly overlay the made ground (001) which was excavated to a depth of 1.45 m.

The stratigraphy on the eastern edge of the excavation appeared to be intact and the peaty clay layer observed during the previous phase of watching brief was visible overlying the river gravels. In this area the concrete slab (004) overlay a thick layer of made ground (001), which in turn overlay the peaty clay (003). The natural river gravels (002) lay underneath the peaty clay.

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
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
