Editorial

In this time of economic recession Northern Archaeology is fortunate to have the unfailing support of the Northumberland Archaeological Group who continue to cushion the blows of possible financial disaster. We should like to offer our thanks for their belief in the role that this periodical has to play in the archaeology of the North. The straitjackets imposed on the whole of British archaeology have substantially retarded expansion and innovation in our own area. This is particularly unfortunate as archaeology in the North has never fully received the attention or resources which would allow a more comprehensive study of the archaeological record available to us.
