

POST-SCRIPT

NAG, in cooperation with the Cheviot Field Centre, has just produced its first major volume other than Northern Archaeology, Roger Miket's Prehistory of Tyne and Wear. This should be a must for all members, and for all interested in our region's antiquity, for it catalogues and illustrates every prehistoric artefact and site known from Tyne and Wear. Those who think the area is only about the Roman Wall will be surprised to discover how rich the prehistoric material is - from Mesolithic flints to Romano-British settlements. The book represents outstanding value for individual members, at £7 for the soft back and £8.50 for the hardback. Non-members will have to pay £10.50 for the softback and £12 for the hardback. NAG membership remains an outstanding bargain !

EDITORIAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Contributions should be typewritten, on one side only of A4 paper, double-spaced with a wide left margin. Pages should be numbered.
2. A brief summary should precede the main text.
3. The Harvard bibliographical system should be used throughout, thus (Smith, 1942, 284-5, fig 5), (Smith and Jones, 1921, 100-1), in text, or (Smithers et al, 1989, 326) where more than two authors are involved. A full bibliography in alphabetical order should be given at the end of the paper. Entries should be in the following form :-

Smith, J.X., 1942 Three axes from Outer Mongolia, Proc Roy Archaeol Soc, 2 ser, 26(2), 84-5.

Smithers, Y.J., 1951 The Stone Axes of Outer Mongolia, 2 ed (Birmingham), 103-13.

Smithers, Z., Jones, X.R., and Carruthers, P., 1989. Outer Mongolian double-ended axe-hammers, in Jones, P.(ed), Recent Work in Mongolian Archaeology = International Archaeol and Architect Reports, 26, 322-8 (Birmingham).

(NOTE: Titles should use lower case for papers, and upper case for books).

4. Notes should be kept to a minimum and preferably not used at all. They should certainly not be a substitute for a bibliographical reference in text.
5. Line drawings should be given a firm number in the text, e.g. (Fig. 8), but plate numbers will be allocated by the editors, and should appear as (Pl. 00) in the typescript.
NOTE: Capitals should be used for figures and plates appearing in the paper being submitted, eg. (Fig. 20) or (Pl. 00), but use lower case in quoting other sources eg. (fig. 30) or (pl. XXV).
6. The positioning of illustrations in relation to the text should be indicated in pencil in the margin at the appropriate point.
7. Words which would normally appear in italics should be underlined.
8. Dimensions should normally be quoted in metric form ie. 35 mm,

35 m, 35 km.

9. The print area of a page is 220 x 160 mm. To allow for a caption, drawings should be of a proportion to fit a space 220 x 145 mm, or 205 x 160 mm (landscape). Illustrations should be numbered, preferably in blue pencil, with instructions for reduction included.

10. Permission for reproducing copyright material is the responsibility of contributors, and should have been obtained before copy is submitted.
