There are 569 items currently retrieved from the evaluation. Table 1 above shows the break down by material type, whilst table 2 shows the spot dates and pottery descriptions.

### **Animal Bone**

Recommended for discard by specialist.

#### Lithic

The lithic assemblage is indicative of flint blade-working technology, and should be retained.

## Metal

The majority of the iron is unidentifiable at this time and requires further specialist assessment, including by x-ray. There was a single copper-alloy buckle plate with foliate decoration that dates from the medieval period. Retention of the metal finds assemblage will be discussed with the local collections repository.

# **Pottery and CBM**

There was a total of 334 sherds of pottery, weighing 3.6kg, with a further 43 fragments of Ceramic Building material, weighing 1.7kg. The majority of pottery and CBM has been provisionally dated to the post-medieval period, dating from the 17<sup>th</sup> century. Earlier sherds were recorded and discussed below; all prehistoric and roman pottery sherds should be retained.

# Methodology

The pottery was rapidly assessed visually (by eye) and sorted into broad ware classes and periods which included: prehistoric, Romano-British, medieval, and post-medieval wares. Each ware class was quantified by count, weight, and broad spot date. Identified sherds were recorded using national guidance in accordance with national guidelines *A Standard for Pottery Studies in Archaeology* (Barclay et al 2016). Where possible, nationally distributed and regional products were identified, and

broad date ranges provided. A catalogue of all material provided in Appendix 1 (associated Excel spreadsheet). No in-depth fabric analysis or background research was undertaken, and date ranges may change upon further work.

### **Prehistoric**

There were 85 sherds of possible prehistoric pottery weighting 285g that were retrieved from 6 contexts from trenches 87, 171, 304, 491 and 533. The pottery consists of coarse handmade vessels, with erratic stone, flint, and occasional grog temper. A single sherd from context 17111 was a small flat rimed jar with incised/slashed decoration on the rim. Whilst 53303 and 55305 had an everted rim jar also hand made with erratic stone and flit temper.

### Roman

There were 22 fragments of Romano-British pottery, weighing 436g, that date from the 2<sup>nd</sup> century onwards, recovered from Trenches 87, 302, and 1243. Spot dates were given based on rim profiles and identifiable features such as mortaria trituration grits. Only key vessels have been recorded in detail. The majority of the sherds were locally made greywares or were unidentifiable to type at this stage.

Context 87 contained a Black burnished ware, bead and flange conical bowl that dates from the 3<sup>rd</sup> century, and a necked beaded jar in a local grey fabric. Context 8708 contained a fragment of an Oxfordshire red slipped ware mortaria, also dating from the 3<sup>rd</sup> century.

Context 30205 also had a fragment of a bead and flanged bowl dating from the 3<sup>rd</sup> century, whilst context 30206 had the base of an indented fine ware beaker in a grey fabric with black slip that dates form the mid-to-late 2nd century

Context 124309 had a fragment of an oxidised sandy bodysherd with a handle scar of a tankard, possibly produced locally (South West Oxidised ware), along with a fragment of a box flue tile with combed surface. This context also contained 3 sherds of brown-glazed oxidised ware dating to the post-medieval period.

A full breakdown of contexts with spot dates can be found in Table 2, with a basic quantification of the possible medieval and post medieval wares. It should also be noted this was a rapid assessment for broad spot dates based on identifiable features such as decoration and or rim profile. Erroneous bodysherds were noted by feel and main inclusion if seen.
