

Articles must be received not later than 31st October for consideration for the volume published the following year.

Manuscripts should not normally exceed 3,000 words in length. One copy of the manuscript should be submitted, the author retaining another. A style sheet is available which should be consulted for details of referencing, illustrations etc. Every contributor is asked to follow the layout described in the style sheet. Each contribution should be accompanied by a brief abstract (100-150 words) summarizing its contents. Ten free off-prints will be supplied to authors on publication of a paper.
