Notes for contributors

Articles can be sent at any time, but must be received by October 31st for consideration for the volume published the following year.

Manuscripts should not normally exceed 3000 words in length. They should be typed on good quality A4 paper, double spaced and with a good left-hand margin (30mm). Authors are requested to follow the layout and conventions described in the style sheet (available on request). Manuscripts should contain a brief summary (100 – 150 words) for translation into French and German. One copy should be submitted to each of the editors, the author retaining a third copy.

Galley proofs will be sent to all authors for checking (not re-writing). Failure to return the proofs by the required date will lead to the editors sending their own corrected proofs to the printer without further reference to the author. Ten free off-prints will be supplied to authors on publication of a paper.

All statements and views published in *Medieval Ceramics* are those of the contributors alone, and not the responsibility of the Editors or the MPRG.
