

Notes for Contributors

Articles can be submitted at any time, but must be received by October 31st for consideration for the volume to be published the following year.

Manuscripts should not normally exceed 3000 words in length; they should contain a brief summary (100-150 words) for translation into other languages. They should be typed on good quality A4 paper, double-spaced and with a good left-hand margin (30 mm). Authors are requested to follow the layout and conventions used in this journal (a style sheet is available on request). One copy of the manuscript should be sent to each of the editors at the following addresses:
