Contributions can be submitted at any time, but main papers, which are subject to peer review, must be received by August 31st for consideration for the volume to be published the following year.

Manuscripts should contain a brief summary (100-150 words) for translation into other languages. They should be typed or printed on good quality A4 paper, double-spaced and with a good left-hand margin (30mm). Authors are requested to follow the layout and conventions used in this journal (copies of the full *Notes for Contributors* will shortly be available on the website or on request from the Editors). Three copies of the manuscript with drafts of all artwork and tables should be sent to:

Proofs will be sent to all authors for checking (not re-writing). Failure to return the proofs by the required date will lead to the editors sending their own corrected proofs to the printer without further reference to the author.
