## Notes for contributors

Contributions can be submitted at any time, but main papers, which are subject to peer review, must be received by 31st August for consideration for the volume to be published the following year.

Manuscripts should contain a brief summary (100–150 words) for translation into other languages. They should be typed or printed on good quality A4 paper, double-spaced and with a good left-hand margin (30 mm). Authors are requested to follow the layout and conventions used in this journal. Three copies of the manuscript with drafts of all artwork and tables should be sent to: The Editor, MPRG, c/o SUAT Ltd, 55 South Methven Street, Perth PH1 5NX.

Authors, where feasible, should make every effort to ensure that their contribution comes with some publication grant aid.

Proofs will be sent to all authors for checking (not re-writing). Failure to return the proofs by the required date will lead to the editors sending their own corrected proofs to the printer without further reference to the author. Ten free offprints and a pdf version on disc will be supplied to the authors on publication of a paper.
