The group has been dormant for many years, but in October 2008 it was revived by Ben Jervis, who organised a meeting in Southampton on the subject of 15th- to 17th-century pottery in southern England, a period in which our understanding of ceramics in the region is somewhat patchy. Several speakers described work on assemblages from Southampton, Wiltshire, Dorset and the Surrey–Hampshire border, and there was the chance to view pottery from Southampton.

The meeting was well attended, and the intention is to try and organise at least one meeting per year; the next is likely to be on the subject of early medieval pottery.

Group meeting 2006

The Scottish Group met on 25th July 2006 and discussed Conference reports SPMA, Livorno Italy and MPRG, Chester, ICPS sampling in Scotland, the Scottish redware sourcing project, a putative Scottish lead sourcing project and continuing damage at the Colstoun production site. There then followed a viewing of pottery currently being worked on by members of the group.

Pottery training day

In June 2007 George Haggarty and Derek Hall presented a training day on Scottish Medieval Ceramics at the National Museums Scotland Customs House, Leith. This was attended by 12 people from Scottish units and museums.

New Carron Road, Stenhousemuir

In 2007 SUAT Ltd undertook further excavations at Stenhousemuir adjacent to previous excavations of the late medieval pottery production site. This was in advance of a new housing scheme by Kier Homes Ltd, it is intended to publish these excavations in Medieval Ceramics Volume 30.

In October 2007 National Museums Scotland hosted a day seminar to discuss the recent new C14 dates for carbonised shellyware pottery from London and Perth.
