

#### **Notes for contributors**

Contributions can be submitted at any time, but main papers, which are subject to peer review, must be received by 31st August for consideration for the volume to be published the following year.

Manuscripts should contain a brief summary (100– 150 words) for translation into other languages. They should be types or printed on good quality A4 paper, double-spaced and with a good left-hand margin (30 mm). Authors are requested to follow the layout and conventions used in this journal. Authors, where feasible, should make every effort to ensure that their contribution comes with some publication grant aid.
