However, as a matter of policy Bedfordshire Archaeological Council decided to use *Bedford Archaeological Journal* 15 (1981) for a single item, *sc.* C.L. Matthews *et multi alii*, 'A Roman Inhumation Cemetery at Dunstable', which had been submitted at the same time. Publication of the contents of this volume thus has been delayed.

Another paper was submitted early in 1983 and this has been included in *Bedfordshire Archaeology* 16.
