

## Report of the Council

FOR THE YEAR 1910.

---

**T**HE Council beg to present their Report for the year 1910.

During the year, sixteen new members were elected, whilst thirteen members, either through death or resignation, have been lost to the Society.

The Council regret to record the death of the following members, *viz.*, the Right Honourable John E. Ellis, M.P. (a Vice-President), Mr. Samuel Page (a former member of the Council), the Rev. Baron Von Hube, the Rev. T. W. Swann, Major General W. E. Warrand, Mr. Henry Fellows, and Mr. Robert Halford, J.P.

The Council held nine meetings during the twelve months. Mr. T. M. Blagg, F.S.A., late of Newark, has intimated that owing to his having taken up his residence in Buckinghamshire, he will be unable to attend to his duties on the Council of the Society. The Council much regret losing him from their meetings, but are glad to say that he is willing to remain on the Editorial Committee, and to continue to place his large and varied knowledge of antiquarian subjects at the disposal of the Society.

The Society was represented at the Annual Congress of Archæological Societies in London by its two delegates, Rev. A. D. Hill, M.A., and Mr. W. P. W. Phillimore, M.A., B.C.L.

The Treasurer's usual financial statement is appended to this report. The Council again beg to urge upon the members of the Society the desirability of an earlier payment of their subscriptions. It is scarcely fair to the Treasurer of the Society that several applications should in many cases have to be made before the amount is received.

The Society became established in its new headquarters

at Bromley House, Nottingham, early in the year. The advantages of this room, with its pleasant environment and central position, must be manifest to those who have visited it. The Council hope that as the room, with the library of books of reference now gradually accumulating, becomes more known, it will be made more use of by the members.

During the year a large number of surplus back copies of the Society's Transactions from 1897 to 1905 has been distributed among village libraries throughout the county, under the supervision of Mr. Blagg. It is hoped that these will be read and appreciated, and an interest in the antiquities of the county thereby stimulated in the various village communities.

On the 7th of July, Dr. F. Appleby, the Mayor of Newark, kindly invited the members of the Society to a garden party at his house in that town. He threw open his extensive garden to the visitors, and provided for inspection a large and interesting collection of ecclesiastical and civic plate, and engravings, which were described by Mr. Blagg.

On the 8th of September, Mr. Albert Ball, J.P., Mayor of Nottingham, very generously asked the members to visit his recently acquired property of Tattershall Castle, in Lincolnshire, and to have luncheon with him at Woodhall Spa. A party of some fifty members availed themselves of this enjoyable way of seeing this fine tower, perhaps one of the best specimens of early brickwork in England, which was erected about 1440 by Ralph, Lord Cromwell, of Nottinghamshire origin who was custodian of Nottingham Castle. The building and its surroundings were described to the visitors in a very able manner by Dr. E. Mansel Sympson, of Lincoln. Tattershall Church, a fine cruciform Perpendicular building, notable for its fenestration, its stone screen, and its brasses, was also inspected. In the afternoon some of the party visited the beautiful little 13th century Chapel of St. Leonard, which stands outside the site of the gate of the now vanished Cistercian Abbey of Kirkstead; the triple arch over the west door pierced with a *vesica*-shaped window, its interior richly

vaulted in three bays, the remains of a 13th century screen worked into the deal pews, and other features of the building, proved of great interest.

On 7th June an excursion was organised, the district covered being the Soar Valley. Commencing at Stanford-on-Soar, and visiting Normanton-on-Soar, West Leake, Kingston, Ratcliffe-on-Soar, and Sutton Bonington, the visitors found much of interest for inspection, and papers were read at most of the places enumerated.

Two Winter Meetings were held in 1910:—on February 19th, when papers were read by Mr. J. Potter Briscoe, F.R.S.L., City Librarian, on *The Charm and Scope of Antiquarian Research*, and by Mr. Bernard Smith, of the Geological Survey Office, London, on *The Topography of North-East Nottinghamshire*; and on November 30th, when Mr. Harry Gill read a paper, profusely illustrated with lantern slides, on *Nottinghamshire Low Side Windows*. Both meetings attracted good audiences, and the thanks of the Society are due to the gentlemen who read the papers.

The Council are glad to report that through their instrumentality several useful works have been accomplished. The attention of the City Council was called to the expediency of having the Borough Records transcribed, printed, and brought down from 1702, the date at which the previous issue ceased, to a more recent period. The City Council concurred in this, and entrusted the work to Mr. Everard L. Guilford, M.A., a member of the Society.

Some correspondence has passed between the Council and the Vicar of Halam, near Southwell, in reference to a bell in that church, said to be the oldest bell in the county, with the satisfactory result that it is ascertained to be in good preservation and will be carefully safeguarded.

Annesley old Church, it is hoped, will shortly receive the attention that it sadly needs.

The whipping-post at Radcliffe-on-Trent, mentioned in last year's report, has not yet been placed in its original position, but its early re-instatement now seems likely.

An interesting discovery of Roman coins has been made in the city. These are now in the safe keeping of the civic authorities, and will, it is hoped, be described by Professor F. Granger in the Transactions of this Society. The coins range over the period A.D. 70 to 160 (from Vespasian to Marcus Aurelius).

The Council note with satisfaction that a small body of gentlemen interested in archæological research have during the past summer taken in hand excavations at the site of the Roman station of *Margidunum* ; very interesting discoveries have been and are being made, and they are such as will enlarge our knowledge of the Roman occupation of this county.

The Council desire to express their regret at the destruction of old buildings that still goes on year after year in the city. During 1910 the Postern Gate Inn, at the top of Drury Hill, at the site of one of the entrances to the old town, has been demolished and replaced by a red brick and stone building—this demolition in no way contributed to a street improvement or the material widening of the adjacent thoroughfare.

In pulling down some old house property in Chapel Bar, a most interesting specimen of 16th century pargetting work was revealed, but it was eventually broken up.

Additions to the Society's Record Series are hampered and delayed by want of funds, and the diversion of funds to other objects ; for this reason the volume of Inquisitions, the issue of which was foreshadowed in the Council's report for 1908, has not yet been completed.

The Council are glad to report that in pursuance of the suggestion made in 1908 to obtain a record of the tombstone inscriptions throughout the county, the Rev. A. H. Sutherland, of Edwalton, has rendered his to the Society, and Mr. Brewill has also recorded those at Wilford in a very complete and detailed manner. Mr. F. W. Dobson also has caused all the inscriptions in St. Mary's, St. Peter's, and St. Nicholas' Churchyards to be put on record.

The Council are quite conscious of the large amount of antiquarian work that remains to be done in the town and county of Nottingham. Unfortunately research hitherto has been allowed to rest on the shoulders of very few, and the Editor would welcome papers, especially original work, for publication in the Transactions.
