

SCHEDULE OF PAYMENTS FROM THE ARCH-  
DEACONRY OF BUCKINGHAM OF A.D. 1460.

[By REV. F. W. RAGG, M.A., F.R.Hist.S., LATE VICAR  
OF MARSWORTH.]

The document following is evidently that referred to by Browne Willis in the Browne Willis MS. I. 553—556 (Bodleian), thus:—

“In the Archdeacon of Buckingham Office kept at Alesbury is an Antient book of Peter’s Pence collected by his Officers and remitted to Rome, in it is a list of all the churches and chapells that paid them, and over against the Vicarage is wrote the names of the Convent they were appropriated to. It is wrote on a sheet of paper in double columns as here transcribed, but being ill-kept is somewhat obliterated and torn. I here attempt to copy on its being lent me Oct. 11 1727 by Mr. Register Bell’s Deputy. The Title is Quaternus redituum Archidiaconatus Bucks extractus ex vetere rotulo M. Rog. . . . est . . . ff’ anno primi Edwardj Quarti i.e. 1460.”

At the end of this book is wrote in another hand a deed of Eton College, dated “le 10 Sept. 22 Henr. VI.”

The Title, of which part was illegible (at least to me) in the MS. of Browne Willis, appears to be “Schedule of the payments from the Archdeaconry of Bucks extracted from the old roll of Mr. Roger [ . . . est] firmari[us], i.e. farmer or collector—I. Edw. IV.”

The copy made by Browne Willis gives the idea that probably little of the “book” was then lost. When I copied it, having it and other documents lent to me by Archdeacon Bourke for the purpose of decipherment and transcription, title and date were gone, and parts were undecipherable. Questions are suggested by the amounts which I put before Bishop Stubbs. He was unable to answer them, and I am still less able. The schedule appears to have been made for an Archdeacon of the 15th century of later date than the Roll from which it states itself to have been taken. The notes made about

enquiries would seem to have been made by him. It will be seen that much has been lost: *e.g.* the whole deaneries of Buckingham and Newport, and that Aylesbury does not occur in the Wendover Deanery list:— †

Valor Ecclesiasticus of circiter 1546 are Burnham, Muresley (with part under the Jurisdiction of St. Alban) Waddeston, Bucks, Newporte, Wendover, Risborough, which only contained Risborough and Halton, and Wycombe. The small deanery of Risborough is in this schedule included in that of Wendover. In the 1546 MS. West Wycombe is given as Hamigdowne also West Wycombe. This is the Haveryngdon of the Schedule.

Whereas the reverend father in Christ and lord, the lord William by God's grace bishop of Lincoln at the instance of the most dread prince the lord Henry, by God's grace King of England and France and lord of Ireland, duly and lawfully has appropriated the parish church of Eton as aforesaid to us the provost and fellows and the College aforesaid and has released and exempted us the provost and fellows and all parishioners of the parish of Eton aforesaid from the jurisdiction of the Archdeacon of Buckingham and his control; and has granted and given to the provost of the said College and his successors all Archidiaconal jurisdiction and every kind of jurisdiction which the Archdeacons of Buckingham have been wont to possess within the said parish; and to the venerable Master Thomas Bekynton Archdeacon of the aforesaid Archdeacony and his successors Archdeacons of the aforesaid Archdeaconry, for himself, Master Thomas, and his successors in compensation for the loss thereof has ordered and assigned an annual pension of 20 and 2 shillings and 11 pence sterling, to be paid by us the provost and fellows of the said College at the feast of St. Michael the Archangel, as in the letters patent of the said reverend father drawn up there for, is plainly shown: we accordingly, the provost and fellows aforesaid wishing to show obedience to the aforesaid reverend father and to further his present purpose in the aforesaid matter; the licence of the lord King himself having been first obtained, by the common consent of us and of the whole College aforesaid have given and granted to the Archdeacon aforesaid as the aforesaid compensation the said yearly pension of 22 shillings and 11 pence from our manor of Bledlow in the county of Buckingham, to be had and received, the aforesaid annual pension by the aforesaid Archdeacon and his successors Archdeacons of Buckingham, for all time, at the feast

And should it happen that the said annual pension or any portion of it is in arrear, not paid after the feast aforesaid for two months consecutively counted from the time of proper requisition by the said Archdeacon for the time being or by any of his officials made to the said provost or the vice-provost or to any of the bursars of the said College acting in this matter, it shall then be lawful for the aforesaid Archdeacon and his successors aforesaid and their assigns to make distraint in the whole aforesaid manor with the appurtenances, by seizing all goods and chattels there found; and to retain the goods so distrained, to take or lead them away, until full satisfaction is given for the said annual pension and its arrears. In attestation of which to the one part of this writing of indenture remaining with the aforesaid Archdeacon and his successors we have affixed our common seal; to the other part which remains with us, the aforesaid Archdeacon has affixed his seal. Given in our said royal College of the Blessed Mary of Eton the 10th day of September in the year of the reign of King Henry the 6th after the Conquest 22—(A.D. 1443).
