## *Aylesbury*

A thirteenth-century jug was found when digging foundation trenches by Mr. P. Carr. N.G.R. SP 819138 (463.67)

## *Aylesbury, 6 Castle Street*

Medieval and post-medieval sherds and a seventeenth-century spur were found when excavating foundations by various people N.G.R. SP 817138 (196, 236.67)

## *Aylesbury, 4-8 Market Street*

A sixteenth-century dish and post-medieval sherds were found by Mr. L. A. Ricketts when excavating foundations. N.G.R. SP 819138 (155.67)

## *Bletchley*

Romano-British sherds were found by Messrs. R. W. Griffiths and B. Stickland in 1965 in the side of a sewer trench. N.G.R. SP 860352 (423.67)

## *Bletchley, Water Eaton*

Romano-British sherds were found by Mr. H. W. Pengelly in spoil from a trench excavated for sewage pipes. N.G.R. SP 880323 and 881322

## *Bletchley, Stoke Road*

An As of Trajan was found by Mr. J. Tidborough when digging the entrance to a garage. N.G.R. SP 881326 (303.67)

## *Bletchley, 20 Newton Road*

Twelfth to thirteenth-century sherds were found on the surface of the garden by Mr. R. W. Griffiths. N.G.R. SP 856332

## *Bletchley*

Medieval sherds were found on the surface of a ploughed field by Mr. H. W. Pengelly. N.G.R. SP 872325

*Bletchley, Denbigh Hall*

Medieval sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in a trench dug for a gas or water main. N.G.R. SP 862354 (431.67)

*Bow Brickhill*

Romano-British sherds and slag were found in a contemporary ditch by Mr. R. W. Griffiths when a trench for a gas pipeline was excavated. N.G.R. SP 894334 (412.67)

*Bow Brickhill*

Thirteenth-century sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in a trench dug for a pipeline. N.G.R. SP 889352 (426.67)

*Buckingham, 15 and 17 Westfield*

Medieval sherds were found on the surface of the garden by Mr. R. W. Griffiths. N.G.R. SP 691336 (427.67)

*Burnham, Burnham Beeches*

A palaeolithic hand axe was found in a stream by Mr. D. I. J. Parker. N.G.R. SU 950844 (374.67)

*Cold Brayfield*

Thirteenth-century sherds were found on the surface of a ploughed field by Mr. W. Britnell. N.G.R. SP 933530

*Fulmer*

A Romano-British pottery kiln and associated pit were excavated by the Buckinghamshire County Museum, under the direction of Miss N. Tarrant. The wares appear to date from the second century A.D. N.G.R. SU 992867 (200.67)

*Great Linford*

Romano-British sherds were found on the surface of a ploughed field by Messrs. R. W. Griffiths and D. C. Mynard. N.G.R. SP 866404

Thirteenth to fourteenth-century sherds were found on the surface of a ploughed field by Messrs. R. W. Griffiths and D. C. Mynard. N.G.R. SP 867406

*Great Linford*

The site of a Shrunken Medieval Village was discovered from air photographs. N.G.R. SP 855417 and SP 856418

*Hanslope*

Romano-British sherds and roofing tile were found on the surface of a ploughed field by Messrs. D. C. Mynard and O. Ransom. N.G.R. SP 772481

*Hanslope, Castlethorpe Road*

Twelfth to thirteenth-century sherds were found in foundation trenches for a new house by Mr. H. A. Morgan. N.G.R. SP 800466

*Hanslope*

A medieval sherd and building material were found on the surface of a ploughed field on the site of a house platform by Messrs. D. C. Mynard and O. Ransom.

*Latimer*

Part of an upper stone of an Iron Age puddingstone quern was found by Mr. Howarth in 1964 during forestry clearance. N.G.R. SU 995006

*Lavendon*

Romano-British sherds and building material were found by Mr. W. Britnell on the surface of a ploughed field and from where a hedge had been removed.

Eleventh and thirteenth-century sherds were found on the surface of a ploughed field by Mr. W. Britnell. N.G.R. SP 916546

*Lavendon, Castle Road*

Part of a twelfth-century stamped handle was found by Mr. W. Britnell when a drive was being widened. N.G.R. SP 917538 (181.67)

*Little Brickhill*

The following finds were made by members of the Bletchley Archæological and Historical Society when a gas pipeline was being laid:

A hoard of 296 Roman silver denarii. A Coroner's Inquest was held and the hoard declared Treasure Trove. (3.68)

A group of five Romano-British tools associated with a hearth. (234.67)

Two cobbled areas, two pits and a ditch containing second-century A.D. pottery and animal bones.

*Little Brickhill*

Romano-British sherds and a piece of whetstone were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in spoil from a trench dug for a gas pipeline. N.G.R. SP 893332 (414.67)

*Little Brickhill, 1 Wyness Avenue*

Medieval sherds and a piece of floor tile were found on the surface of the garden by Mr. R. W. Griffiths. N.G.R. SP 911323 (448.67)

*Little Horwood*

Romano-British sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in topsoil scraped from the surface of a field. N.G.R. SP 801324 (406.67)

*Little Horwood, 5A Church Street*

Medieval and post-medieval sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in spoil from a trench. N.G.R. SP 790307 (450.67)

*Little Kimble, Grove Cottage*

Seven second to fourth-century A.D. bronze coins were dug up in the garden by Mr. R. Malin some years ago. N.G.R. SP 820065

*Loughton*

Romano-British sherds were found on the surface of a ploughed field by Mr. R. W. Griffiths. N.G.R. SP 854362

*Loughton*

The site of a Shrunken Medieval Village was discovered from air photographs. N.G.R. SP 839375

*Maids Moreton*

An Early Iron Age iron axe was ploughed up in the centre of a circular enclosure by Mr. G. Beckett. N.G.R. SP 724347

*Milton Keynes*

Romano-British sherds and building materials were found on the surface of a ploughed field by Messrs. R. W. Griffiths and D. C. Mynard. N.G.R. SP 894378

*Milton Keynes*

The site of a Shrunken Medieval Village was discovered by Mr. D. C. Mynard. N.G.R. SP 890392

*Milton Keynes*

The discovery of skeletons during gravel extraction was reported by Mr. H. E. Kitchener. The Wolverton and District Archæological Society found that the skeletons were in graves and were earlier in date than the twelfth century A.D. N.G.R. SP 892394

*Newton Longville*

Romano-British sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in the spoil from a trench dug for a water main. N.G.R. SP 848324 (409.67)

*Olney, 20 Spinney Hill Road*

Romano-British sherds were found on the surface of the garden by Mr. R. W. Griffiths. N.G.R. SP 881514 (408.67)

*Olney, Olney Hyde*

A platform in the Deserted Medieval Village was excavated under the direction of Mr. P. Mayes and Mr. D. C. Mynard. A stone built circular, single flue kiln, clay pit and workshop were found. The wares produced date from the fourteenth century. N.G.R. SP 887545

*Olney, Olney Hyde*

A medieval iron arrowhead was found by Mr. G. Needham. N.G.R. SP 890547 (23.67)

*Shenley Brook End*

The site of a Deserted Medieval Village was discovered from air photographs. N.G.R. SP 832358

Thirteenth-century sherds were collected from the surface of a ploughed field on the site of the Deserted Medieval Village. N.G.R. SP 830358 (460.67)

*Shenley Brook End*

Thirteenth to seventeenth-century sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in 1966 on the surface of a ploughed field. N.G.R. SP 844366 (440.67)

*Shenley Church End*

An enclosure with moats was discovered from air photographs. N.G.R. SP 824366  
The site of a Shrunken Medieval Village was discovered. N.G.R. SP 826365

*Simpson*

Medieval sherds were found by Mr. A. Knight in spoil from a trench for water pipes. N.G.R. SP 884356

*Soulbury, Manor Farm*

Sherds of a thirteenth to fourteenth-century jug were found when digging a hole in a field by Mr. R. W. Lloyd-Hunt. N.G.R. SP 884268 (465.67)

*Stewkley*

Fourteenth-century sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in spoil from a trench. N.G.R. SP 855261 (441.67)

*Stoke Hammond*

Thirteenth to fourteenth-century sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in spoil excavated for the extension of farm buildings. N.G.R. SP 881291 (446.67)

*Tattenhoe*

Romano-British sherds and part of a quern stone were found on the surface of a ploughed field by Mr. R. W. Griffiths. N.G.R. SP 820333 (410.67)

*Tattenhoe*

Medieval sherds and part of a quern stone were found in 1966 on the surface of a ploughed field on the site of a Deserted Medieval Village by Messrs. R. W. Griffiths and D. C. Mynard. N.G.R. SP 829341 (447.67)

*Walton*

Medieval sherds were found on the surface of a ploughed field by Mr. A. Knight. N.G.R. SP 886368

*Warrington*

Twelfth to thirteenth-century sherds were found by Messrs. R. W. Griffiths and D. C. Mynard in a roadside ditch. N.G.R. SP 897541

*Wavendon*

Romano-British sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in a small U-shaped ditch during road widening. N.G.R. SP 916353 (407.67)

*Wendover, Wendover Forest*

Part of a bronze knife or dagger was found on the surface and reported by Mr. R. Franklin. N.G.R. SP 881079

*Westcott*

The site of a Shrunken Medieval Village was discovered.

*Westcott*

Sherds of a late thirteenth to fourteenth-century jug and part of a medieval stone mortar were found in foundation trenches and reported by Mr. W. George.

*Wing, 57-61 High Street*

Thirteenth to fourteenth-century sherds were found by Mr. R. W. Griffiths in the foundation trenches for houses.

Twelfth to thirteenth-century sherds were found on the surface of the garden by Mr. R. W. Griffiths.

A moated site was found by Mr. D. C. Mynard.
