WILLIAM I.

For the Cathedral of Lincoln.—Transfer of the seat of the bishopric of Dorchester to the city of Lincoln. Grant of (*inter alia*) four churches : viz., Bedford, Leston, Buckingham, and Aylesbury, which the predecessors of Bishop Remigius had held from the King's grant. Witnessed by Lanfranc, the Archbishop, and E., the Sheriff. Recited in
