The smaller framed panels in the Museum from the Saccara Arch are all carved in Pentelic marble. Numbered clockwise round the room:

1. Largely complete and certainly fitting together
 - (a) Top Panel. Central Victory (R) crowning Geta (L) who clasps hands with the figure at L. end, male, torso naked, draped over L. shoulder + eagle on feet (Jupiter?). Composing L. figure lost.
 - (b) Middle Panel. Apollo - Figure with cornucopia - Julia Domna (?) - Artemis their feet approaching the top of (c)
 - (c) Tyche (?) with balusters - male figure with headress (Aster) - missing - ? Neptune (only extreme top R. hand corner survives, with what looks like two or three prongs of a trident)



2. Two upper panels run together with central gap in steps against a background of columns which rise into top panel (of which the upper part is entirely missing)

Central Panel : Drusus (?) ext. left. R centre Sverus (^{Head of} Hercules) and Caracalla and extreme R a youth full male statue extending R hand in a





6. Top Jupiter-Serapis + Julia Domna flanking (L) by female figures
with conch shells and (R) by Atreus into owl. Correspond to owl, between
L. figure + Julia Domna is another bird (an eagle?)
Middle (L to R)
Female - Mars - missing - missing

Bottom gone, but above top panel are places 2 putti and
wreaths (too rich variant) along the base of which runs
forming the cornice of the Serapis group.

7. Very part of relief is shown as the bottom panel:
Two fragments (not joined)

L. edge togate figure and feet of adjoining figure to R
R. Presumably Hercules, wearing cuirass given a club
and lion skin on arm.

8 The Siege panel.

As they stand 1 and 3 are prominent, each crowned by
a scene with Victory crowning one of emperor's sons.


Perhaps 2 & 4 are prominent, then displayed against an architectural
scene which descends upwards, no conventional columnar,
but shows a facade with down-sloping statues.

That leaves the Siege panel out on a limb. But are 5 & 7
(in couple) rather distinct?


The big panels are all Promission. The following, as now



Important. The Temple of M. Aemilius (Antonine Temple), the white marble is Pentelic throughout the architectural detail, mid. the columns (with cipollino). Only the pavement is Procon. (and the odd - numbered? — stairs)

The S. Forum Temple instead is conventional Procon (x cipollino) as also is T. of Hercules; also Capitoline

In the Theatre the visible (and distinguishable) remains of the scena are in Procon as also are the sculptures of pulpits. But cf. effect of Heracles or These, distinctly striped, and of Hercules which was strikingly used a creamy white streak (not very thick) in an otherwise heavily veined piece (as one can at the end of slab).

There is a great deal of Tunisian (?) dark grey and white marble used for veneer, in elaborate various ranging from narrow sciss to up to patterns closely resembling Egyptian Wedjat forms in texture. Examples: in N. east end of S. Forum Temple, in entrance corridor to Rostra and to latrine.

Hadrinae Banks. The surviving remains of statue, the dip channel & the floor are all Pentelic. The same is true of the large latrine, though at least one of stat. slabs is Procon. The columns in both are of stripy grey & white Tunisian (plus 2 of breccia eratique at E end of smaller latrine). The columns of the two entrance halls and of the natatio are of a fine breccia eratique (see photo). The capitals of the entrance halls appear to be Hadrinian (see photo) — Asiatic but still with the drum substantially independent of the underlying detail. They are Proconⁿ. The two various (Proconⁿ?) grey crystalline.

Panelling of left entrance hall well preserved. See sketch. One pane sheet of Proconⁿ? a replacement.

Much use of heavily striped or streaked grey (Tunisian?) veneer



Capitals (a) are of bone in position has eagle.

(b) one on ground has upper part of what was evidently broken against the wall uncompleted. One can just make out the white sketch on French dressed stone (V. similar approach to unfinished cap photographed near N. door of Sasanian forum)



In Palaeostoa a rather mixed bag; mostly Proconⁿ (a mixt. grey for bases) but some use of atric, or maybe for capitals.

Columns as fossil capitals.

The granite eminence, with exception of Bassica Veteris (Broderus) & a possible Taurensis column in footings of Byz. wall opp Nymphaeum is of Elba type.

Portico on flinters between Theatre + Chalcedonion

(Portico opposite original entrance to macellum is in the? Taurian strongly-streaked grey + white) ^{with fine caps} mid-grey base.

Amongst fine grey breccia limestone buildings with

(a) one on L. side shortly after entering Byz. Gate. It had shallow rectangular pilasters + alcove bases grouped in threes + separated by wide thresholds. A very substantial monument with 5 symmetrical wide doorways.

(b) along S (widened) side of street running E-W along N. side of Forum Nov.

- (i) an angle (photographed) forming effectively NW corner of Church 3 enclosure
- (ii) a N-facing stretch just W of this.

Some constr. as A (shallow alcove based pilasters). (i) makes a sort of irregular piazza at junction of axes, + ii shows continuation of early buildings on this side of the street.

In the Forum Veteris there are two distinct sets of capitals + bases, all of approximately same materials size but differing in materials. Both alike used fluted brownish columns, many found in pavement but some lying as fallen or more or less as fallen. But one set of capitals

and base is in Brock, but set out in Attic marble, which has very badly disintegrated leaving almost shapeless lumps of capitals.

At a hasty count I made out

Pronaos: bases 11

capitals 10

Attic: bases 4

capitals 3

The general impression is that the Attic was used in T. of both Parts, which certainly made extensive use of Attic for decorative interior structures, lesser pilaster capitals, etc.

The sculptured pilasters in the Simean Room are emphatically Proconnesian, as are the fluted equivalents of them (though mouldings of latter much more summarily carved)


Chalcidicum The material of the first building was the grey, shelly limestone used in the earliest F.V. buildings, used with a coating of stucco. Dr survivors

(a) at the extreme corner of the facade, near the Trajanic Arch, where one column base survives *in situ* caught up in concrete of the added portico basin

(b) in remains of central chapel, which includes a fluted column base (sketch opposite), a very damaged capital of the Alexandria/Cyrene type, and a cornice with small corbels, again v. reminiscent of Cyrene-Ptolemais (see *Postscript*); also several blocks of a substantial stone frieze (? from early facade)
