#### Abstract

Summary

South West Archaeology Ltd. (SWARCH) was commissioned by Nia Russell of Mango Planning (the Agent) on behalf of Consolidated Property Group (the Client) to undertake an archaeological excavation on land at Penhale Farm, Fraddon, St Enoder, Cornwall, in advance of the development of the site. This phase of fieldwork follows on from geophysical survey (Bampton 2016) and evaluation trenching (Webb \& Morris 2016) carried out on the site. Extensive open-area excavation undertaken close to the site in the 1990s and 2000s investigated the remains of a Late Prehistoric and Romano-British enclosure ('Penhale Round').

The evaluation trenching undertaken on the site identified an area containing a series of archaeological features and numerous postholes towards the centre of the site. Further works were the subject of a planning condition and area $30 \times 30 \mathrm{~m}$ across was subsequently stripped of topsoil under archaeological supervision. The excavation identified a total of 246 features, including: six ditches; two gullies; eight pits; 172 postholes; and 58 stakeholes. Most of the identified features were undated. However, the ditches were Prehistoric or medieval in date and formed part of the wider multiperiod relict landscape. Several of the postholes could be dated to the medieval and post-medieval period, and most of the postholes and stakeholes encountered are likely to date to this phase. There are documentary records for a postmedieval fair at Penhale, and in c. 1840 the name of this field was Homer Fair Close. On balance, the many postholes on the site are likely to relate to these extremely short-lived but regular bursts of activity. The site at Penhale Farm is now the most extensively-investigated and best-preserved example of this poorly-understood and ephemeral class of site.

### 1.1 Project Background

South West Archaeology Ltd. (SWARCH) was commissioned by Nia Russell of Mango Planning (the Agent) on behalf of Consolidated Property Group (CPG; the Client) to undertake an archaeological excavation in advance of the development of the site. This work was carried out in accordance with a Written Scheme of Investigation (Boyd 2016) drawn up in response to a planning condition and in line with best practice. This report builds upon the results of previous work on the site (Bampton 2016; Webb \& Morris 2016) carried out by SWARCH on behalf of CPG.

### 1.2 Topographical and Geological Background

The site at Penhale is located just off the A30, 1.4km east of St. Enoder and 800 m south-west of Fraddon, on a west-facing slope at an altitude of $c .108 \mathrm{~m}$ AOD (see Figure 1). The soils of this area are the well-drained fine loamy soils of the Denbigh 2 Association, bordering the fine loamy permeable soils variably-affected by groundwater of the Yeollandpark Association (SSEW 1983). These overlie the mudstones and siltstones of the Trendean Mudstone Formation, bordering the hornfelsed slates of the Meadfoot Group (BGS 2017).

### 1.3 HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

St Enoder is located in the Hundreds of Pyder and Powder and in the deanery of Pyder. St Enoder (Heglosenuder in the Domesday Survey) was held by Godric before the Norman Conquest and in 1086 was held by Robert Count of Mortain from the monastery of St Petroc at Bodmin (Martin \& Williams 2002). In the late $13^{\text {th }}$ and early $14^{\text {th }}$ century St Enoder belonged to John le Seneschall and in the $15^{\text {th }}$ century passed to the de Veres of Oxford. Penhale (first recorded 1327) with Fraddon is now a large village located at the junction of the A30 and the former Truro turnpike (now the B3275). The dualling of this stretch of the A30 occurred in the early 1990s; the petrol station, services and hotel were built in the mid 1990s, and the retail park was built after 2001.

An ancient fair was formerly held at Penhale on the $25^{\text {th }}$ of September, although it was moved to Summercourt prior to 1814. The de Veres held two of the three annual fairs held in the parish; these were later purchased Sir Christopher Hawkins from the Rev. Dr. Luttrell Wynne in the $18^{\text {th }}$ century (Lysons 1814). The field name listed in the 1842 tithe apportionment for the site is Homer Fair Close; the field on the other side of the former turnpike is listed as Fair Close. These fields were owned in 1842 by the Rev. William Stackhouse, a maternal relation of the Rev. Luttrell Wynne. On balance therefore, it seems likely the fair was held here prior to its removal to Summercourt.

### 1.4 Archaeological Background

A geophysical survey and evaluation trenching were carried out on the site in 2016 (Bampton 2016; Webb \& Morris 2016). This work identified the ditches of a Prehistoric fieldsystem along with
medieval and post-medieval features, including a possible former routeway. The archaeological potential of this area has long been known, and the extensive open-area excavation of a multivallate Late Prehistoric and Romano-British enclosure ('Penhale Round') have been undertaken immediately to the east of the site. The enclosure was first identified as a cropmark in 1952 and surveyed in 1982 and 1990-91 (Payne 2011). Several parts of the site have been excavated, in 1991 (Nowakowski \& Johns 2015), 1996 (Johnston et al. 1998-9) and 2006 (Hood 2007) but a significant part of the site remains sealed beneath the car park attached to a motel. These excavations exposed two Early Neolithic buildings and a cache of Neolithic Carinated bowls; Middle to Late Bronze Age structures producing Trevisker and Late Bronze Age plain wares; the Late Iron Age round at Penhale and its associated fieldsystem; the round continued to be occupied into the Romano-British period, when a a fogou (a subterranean structure) was built.

### 1.5 Methodology

This document follows the methodology outlined in the Written Scheme of Investigation (Boyd 2016) drawn up in accordance with the CIfA (2014) guidelines and in consultation with Charles Johns (Senior Development Officer (Historic Environment) Cornwall Council). The excavation took place between $15^{\text {th }}$ February and $3^{\text {rd }}$ March 2017. An area measuring $c .35 \times 35 \mathrm{~m}$ across was stripped of topsoil by tracked mechanical excavator to the depth of in situ weathered natural using a toothless grading bucket. Exposed archaeological deposits were excavated by hand in accordance with the WSI and CIFA guidelines.

### 2.1 INTRODUCTION

The excavation was undertaken between $15^{\text {th }}$ February and $3^{\text {rd }}$ March 2017 by SWARCH personnel. The topsoil from an area $c .35 \mathrm{~m} \times 35 \mathrm{~m}$ was removed by a tracked mechanical excavator to the level of in situ weathered natural using a toothless grading bucket. Exposed archaeological features and deposits were excavated by hand in accordance with the WSI and CIFA guidelines. Initially, an area measuring $c .30 \times 30 \mathrm{~m}$ was stripped; this was extended to the north-east and south-west to define the limits of the postholes. A total of 246 features were identified (Figure 3); this included six ditches, two gullies; eight pits; 172 postholes; and 58 stakeholes. The site was subdivided into $5 \times 5 \mathrm{~m}$ squares for the purposes of recording. What follows is a summary of the results of the excavation; detailed context descriptions can be found in Appendix 1, finds in Appendix 2, and a complete set of supporting photographs in Appendix 3.

### 2.2 Deposit Model

A consistent site stratigraphy was identified across the site: a friable mid grey-brown silt-clay topsoil (001) 0.20-0.32m thick, which overlay a mid yellow-brown clay-silt subsoil (002) 0.08-0.15m thick. The natural (003) was a mid yellow-brown soft-firm sand-clay. The thickness of these deposits was greatest to the western part of the site.

Finds recovered from the site strip included: 2 flints ( 9 g ); 2 sherds ( 23 g ) of medieval pottery; 2 sherds $(9 \mathrm{~g})$ of white refined earthenware, 1 fragment $(4 \mathrm{~g})$ of clay pipe stem; and 1 fragment ( 5 g ) of vessel glass from topsoil (001). 1 flint ( 4 g ) and 3 sherds ( 90 g ) of medieval pottery came from subsoil (002).

### 2.3 Results

### 2.3.1 DITCHES

Six ditches [004], [006], [019], [051], [137], and [551] were identified during the excavation (Figure 4). The most recent of these [137] was located at the northern end of the site; it was orientated north-east to south-west, turning at its northern end to run north-north-west by south-south-east. It was $25.3 \mathrm{~m}+$ long and up to 1.7 m wide and 0.24 m deep with moderately-sloping sides and a slightly concave base. It contained a single fill, (138) grey-brown soft silt-clay. This ditch cut several earlier features. It produced 18 sherds $(247 \mathrm{~g})$ of medieval and post-medieval pottery and 9 fragments $(37 \mathrm{~g})$ of clay pipe.

Projecting into the north-west corner of the site and orientated east to west, ditch terminus [004] was $1.80 \mathrm{~m}+$ long and up to 1.30 m wide and 0.54 m deep, with moderately-sloping sides and a concave base. It contained three fills: basal silting fill (047) a grey-yellow clay; and upper fills (005) and (046), both brown-yellow silt-clays. There were no finds.

Slightly sinuous Ditch [006] crossed the site north to south. It was $33 \mathrm{~m}+$ long and up to 1.36 m wide and 0.55 m deep, with steep sides and concave base. It contained five fills: (007), (008) and (009) yellow-red-brown silt-clays; and (036) and(037) both grey-brown silt-clays. Finds from this feature included: 1 sherd ( 16 g ) of possible Romano-British pottery and 6 fragments $(170 \mathrm{~g})$ of corroded iron from the upper fills. Ditch [006] was a re-cut of ditch [040], and it was cut by ditch [137].

A second slightly sinuous ditch [019] crossed the site from west-north-west to east-south-east. It was $30 \mathrm{~m}+$ long and up to 1.50 m wide and 0.72 m deep, with moderately-sloping sides and a concave base. It contained four fills: (025), (026), (027) and (028), all yellow- and grey-brown silt-clays. A single piece of flint $(4 \mathrm{~g})$ came from this feature; while this could be residual, it points to a Prehistoric date for this feature and it may have been associated with ditch [051]. This feature was cut by ditches [006] and [021].

Towards the centre of the western site boundary, ditch terminus [021] projected $c .1 \mathrm{~m}$ into the area excavation and measured 0.83 m wide and 0.43 m deep, with moderate to steep sloping sides and a concave base. It contained two fills: (022) and (023), both yellow-brown silt-clays. It cut ditch [019]. There were no finds.

Projecting into the north-west corner of the trench and orientated north to south, ditch terminus [051] was $c .3 .50 \mathrm{~m}+$ long and up to 0.68 m wide and 0.40 m deep, with steep to near vertical sides and concave base. It contained four fills: basal silting fill (052) blue-grey clay, and upper fills (053), (054) and (055), all brown-grey clays. Five pieces $(96 \mathrm{~g})$ of flint were recovered from this feature, and this would suggest it forms part of a Prehistoric fieldsystem, perhaps associated with ditch [019].

Projecting into the south-east corner of the trench and orientated north to south, ditch terminus [551] was $5.20 \mathrm{~m}+$ long and $c .1 .05 \mathrm{~m}$ wide and up to 0.45 m deep, with moderate to steep sloping sides and a concave base. It contained two fills: (552) and (553), both brown-red-yellow firm siltclays. There were no finds.

### 2.3.2 GULLIES

Two gullies, [139] and [233], were identified during the excavation (Figure 5). Located towards the north-west corner of the site gully [139] was orientated approximately north to south. It appeared to terminate at it northern end just south of ditch [137], and at its southern end within the fills of ditch [019]. It was 7.70 m long and up to 1.10 m wide and 0.19 m deep, with a slightly concave base. It contained two fills: (140) and (141), both grey-brown soft silt-clays. There were no finds.

Gully [233], located towards the western edge of excavation, was slightly curving in plan and orientated east to west. It was 2.30 m long and up to 0.65 m wide and 0.38 m deep, with moderate to steep sloping sides and a slightly concave base. It contained two fills: (234) and (249), both greybrown soft clays. There were no finds, but the curve of the gully might suggest it was contemporary with pit [186].

### 2.3.3 PITS

Eight pits: [010], [038], [098], [186], [479], [488], [527], and [554] were identified across the site (Figure 6). Pit [010], located towards the centre of the site, was sub-oval in plan with a long axis orientated north-east to south-west alignment. It was $2 \times 1.6 \mathrm{~m}$ across and 0.3 m deep with gentle sloping sides and a concave base. It contained two fills: (011) and (012), both red-brown clay silts. There were no finds. Pit [010] cut ditch [006].

To the north, cutting ditch [006], was pit [038]. This was sub-circular in plan and measured c.0.70m in diameter; it was 0.18 m deep with moderately-sloping sides and concave base. It contained a single fill: (039), a grey-brown silt-clay. There were no finds.

Located towards the north-west corner of the site was pit [098]. This was sub-oval in plan with a long axis orientated north-east to south-west; it was $0.89 \times 0.58 \mathrm{~m}$ across and 0.23 m deep, with moderate to steep sloping sides and slightly concave base. It contained two fills: (099) and (100), being red- and yellow-brown silt-clays. There were no finds. Pit [038] cut ditch [006].

Pit [186], located towards the north-eastern corner of the site, was sub-circular in plan and was c. 1.52 m in diameter and 0.31 m deep with steep sloping sides and concave base. It contained three fills: (187), (188) and (189), all yellow-brown silt- and sandy-clays. This feature had been cut by two postholes, [190] and [192], and appeared to be respected by gully [233]. There were no finds.

Pit [479], located towards the south-west corner of the site, was sub-oval in plan with a long axis orientated east-north-east to west-south-west. It measured $0.78 \times 0.43 \mathrm{~m}$ across and 0.12 m deep, with shallow sloping sides and a flat base. It contained a single fill: (480) a charcoal-rich grey-brown siltclay. There were no finds.

To the east of pit [479] was pit [488]. This was oval in plan with a long axis orientated east to west; it was $0.81 \times 0.52 \mathrm{~m}$ across and 0.02 m deep, with steep sides and flat base. It contained two fills: (489) a grey-brown compacted clay, and (490), a charcoal-rich grey-brown silt-clay. There were no finds.

Located towards the north-east corner of the site, pit [527] was sub-circular in plan; c.0.50m in diameter and 0.06 m deep, with gentle sloping sides and concave base. It contained a single fill: (528), a charcoal-rich red-brown silt-clay. There were no finds.

Pit [554], located towards the south-west corner of the site, was sub-circular in plan and measured $c .0 .90 \mathrm{~m}$ in diameter and 0.12 m deep, with steep sloping sides and flat base. It contained a single fill: (555), a brown-yellow-red silt-clay. There were no finds.

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### 2.3.4 Postholes

A very large number of postholes were identified across the site, and while it is possible (even likely) that they relate to structures, their density and spread means that individual structures or alignments could not be identified. All were recorded as containing single fills of grey-brown silt-clay. In order to facilitate reporting the postholes have been sub-divided into six categories (Groups 1-6) based on their size and profile.

There were 28 Group 1 postholes (Figure 7): [013], [101], [109], [111], [115], [123], [176], [192], [216], [220], [222], [228], [230], [237], [277], [307], [345], [371], [387], [389], [399], [423], [433], [457], [459], [461], [471] and [509]. These were all sub-circular to sub-oval in plan, measuring 0.20.36 m in diameter and $0.09-0.34 \mathrm{~m}$ deep with vertical, or near vertical sides and concave base. A single hone was recovered from posthole [433].

There were 80 Group 2 postholes (Figures 8): [056], [058], [064], [068], [070], [074], [076], [078], [080], [082], [084], [088], [090], [092], [094], [096], [113], [121], [125], [127], [129], [135], [168], [172], [174], [180], [184], [194], [202], [204], [212], [218], [224], [239], [243], [245], [247], [251], [279], [294], [296], [299], [301], [303], [305], [309], [315], [317], [321], [323], [327], [329], [333], [349], [355], [365], [369], [379], [383], [393], [397], [421], [443], [463], [465], [469], [473], [475], [497], [499], [515], [517], [521], [533], [535], [537], [539], [541], [545] and [549]. These were subcircular to sub-oval in plan, measuring $0.2-0.48 \mathrm{~m}$ in diameter and $0.02-0.29 \mathrm{~m}$ deep, with moderate to steep sloping sides and concave base. It should be noted that given the shallow depth and truncated nature of many of these features, several may be the truncated remains of postholes from other groups, most likely Group 1. Single sherds of medieval pottery were recovered from postholes [251], [294], [296], and [475]; a single sherd of post-medieval pottery came from posthole [076], and one fragment of clay pipe stem from the fill of posthole [090].

There were 45 Group 3 postholes (Figure 10): [072], [146], [152], [162], [178], [190], [214], [253], [259], [263], [265], [267], [273], [281], [283], [285], [289], [291], [335], [339], [345], [357], [359], [361], [363], [367], [373], [375], [395], [403], [405], [417], [431], [435], [437], [447], [453], [455], [481], [501], [503], [513], [523], [547] and [560]. These were sub-circular to sub-oval in plan, measuring $0.2-0.33 \mathrm{~m}$ in diameter and $0.04-0.26 \mathrm{~m}$ deep, with vertical, or near vertical sides and flat base. One sherd of medieval pottery came from posthole [291], and one fragment of clay pipe stem from posthole [259].

There were seven Group 4 postholes (Figure 11): [133], [200], [241], [271], [519], [531] and [543]. These were sub-circular to sub-oval in plan, measuring $0.2-0.5 \mathrm{~m}$ in diameter and $0.02-0.16 \mathrm{~m}$ deep, with moderate sloping sides and flat base. A single fragment of clay pipe stem came from posthole [133].

There were 10 Group 5 postholes (Figure 11): [060], [154], [182], [196], [198], [206], [232], [269], [319] and [325]. These were sub-circular to sub-oval in plan, measuring 0.2-0.64m in diameter and $0.09-0.28 \mathrm{~m}$ deep with a $V$-shaped profile. A single fragment of clay pipe stem came from posthole [196].

Group 6 contained only two postholes (Figure 11): [170] and [477]. These were sub-circular to suboval in plan, measuring 0.24-0.42m in diameter and 0.07-0.28m deep with moderate to steep sloping sides and undulating, double-post bases. There were no finds.

### 2.3.5 STAKEHOLES

A large number of stakeholes were identified across the site. As with the postholes, their number and density means that individual structures or alignments could not be identified. All were recorded with fills of grey-brown silt-clay. They have been sub-divided into six categories.

There were 18 Group 1 stakeholes: [158], [160], [166], [287], [347], [351], [381], [385], [391], [413], [429], [449], [451], [491], [493], [495], [525] and [529]. These were sub-circular to sub-oval in plan, measuring 0.14-0.19m in diameter and 0.07-0.28m deep, with vertical or near vertical sides and a concave base. Single fragments of clay pipe stem came from stakeholes [351] and [429].

There were 18 Group 2 stakeholes: [103], [105], [107], [117], [119], [131], [156], [210], [226], [255], [257], [311], [313], [347], [377], [425], [467] and [486]. These were sub-circular to sub-oval in plan, measuring $0.12-0.19 \mathrm{~m}$ in diameter and $0.02-0.14 \mathrm{~m}$ deep with vertical, or near vertical sides and a concave base. A single fragment of clay pipe stem came from stakehole [255].

There were 17 Group 3 stakeholes: [142], [144], [261], [275], [331], [337], [343], [353], [401], [409], [411], [415], [427], [439], [441], [445] and [505]. These were sub-circular to sub-oval in plan, measuring $0.15-0.19 \mathrm{~m}$ in diameter and $0.04-0.20 \mathrm{~m}$ deep with vertical, or near vertical sides and $a$ concave base. There were no finds.

There were five Group 5 stakeholes: [062], [208], [419], [507] and [511]. These were sub-circular to sub-oval in plan, measuring $0.1-0.19 \mathrm{~m}$ in diameter and $0.09-0.30 \mathrm{~m}$ deep, with a V-shaped profile. There were no finds.

### 2.4 FInds

The site produced very few artefacts relative to the number of features excavated. Of the 246 features identified and investigated, only 19 contained finds: ditches [006], [019], [021], [040], [051] and [137]; postholes [076], [090], [133], [196], [251], [259], [291], [294], [296] and [433]; and stakeholes [255], [351] and [429]. The rest of the finds were from the topsoil/subsoil or were unstratified.

### 2.4.1 TOPSOIL AND SUBSOIL

Topsoil (001) contained: 2 (9g) flint flakes; 2 sherds (23g) of micaceous internally-glazed medieval pottery; 2 sherds ( 9 g ) of white refined earthenware, 1 fragment ( 4 g ) of clay pipe stem; and 1 fragment ( 5 g ) of colourless vessel glass. Subsoil (002) contained: 1 ( 4 g ) flint blade fragment; and 3 sherds $(90 \mathrm{~g})$ of micaceous medieval pottery (2 internally-glazed). One (43g) flint core fragment was found unstratified on the site.

### 2.4.2 ARCHAEOLOGICAL FEATURES

Ditch [006] produced 1 sherd ( 16 g ) of Romano-British pottery, and 6 fragments ( 170 g ) of corroded iron from the upper fill. Ditch [019] produced $1(4 \mathrm{~g})$ flint blade with crude retouch from a middle fill. Ditch [051] produced $3(15 \mathrm{~g})$ flint flakes from the basal fill, $1(80 \mathrm{~g})$ flint core from a middle fill, and 1 $(<1 \mathrm{~g})$ flint flake from the upper fill. Ditch [137] contained 17 sherds (233g) of micaceous medieval coarseware (including glazed pieces), 1 sherd of post-medieval Raeren stoneware, and 9 fragments $(37 \mathrm{~g})$ of clay pipe stem.

The finds from the postholes and stakeholes were equally sparse. Single fragments of clay pipe stem, weighing 1-5g each, were recovered from postholes [090], [133], [196], [259], [255], [351] and [429]. Single sherds of micaeous medieval coarseware pottery, weighing 1-12g each, were recovered from postholes [251], [291], [294], [296] and [475]. Posthole [076] produced a single sherd (16g) of $17^{\text {th }}$ century North Devon sgraffito pottery, and Posthole [433] contains a hone stone (243g).

### 2.4.3 DISCUSSION

The relative scarcity of finds, particularly from the ditches, would suggest most of these features are Prehistoric in date. The post-medieval features are clearly distinguished by both the relative abundance of finds, and the character of the fills, which tended to be darker and more humic. Ditches [019] and [051] both contained flint, and while none of the pieces are particularly diagnostic, the mixed (albeit small) assemblage of blades and flakes may point to Neolithic activity, potentially associated with that identified in the wider environs. The recovery of Romano-British pottery is to be expected given the proximity of Penhale Round. The finds from ditch [137] indicate a post-medieval date for this feature. Only a small number of the postholes and stakeholes (14 out of 230) contained artefacts, mainly scraps of medieval micaceous pottery and clay tobacco pipe stems, with one posthole [433] containing a hone stone. Based on the similarity of the fills, it is likely most of these features date to the post-medieval period, within finds derived from the topsoil/subsoil.

### 2.5 DIscussion

The excavation identified a total of 246 features dating from the Prehistoric through to the postmedieval period. The earliest features on the site appear to be ditches [019], [040], and [051]; these are likely to have been quite substantial boundary features, especially in comparison to the size of most of the other excavated features. Ditch [019] is orientated approximately north-west to southeast and roughly parallel to the main Bronze Age field boundary identified during the excavations at Penhale Round to the south-east (Nowacowski \& Johns 2015, 23-30). Ditches [040] and [051] are both roughly perpendicular to this feature, and presumably formed part of the same fieldsystem; the flints in these features are, however, likely to be residual.

Ditch [040] was re-cut as ditch [006] sometime in the Romano-British period, and while undated it is likely that gully [139] belonged to a late phase of the Prehistoric fieldsystem. It terminated within the upper fills of ditch [019], indicating the earlier feature was still identifiable as a boundary. In contrast, ditch [137] defines a post-medieval sub-rectangular enclosure around Penhale Cottages.

A large number of small pits, postholes and stakeholes were identified on this site and it is possible, even likely, that several different phases of activity are represented. The Neolithic phase at Penhale Round included two post-built structures, S3299 and S3053, and it is possible some of the postholes on this site could belong to similar early post-built buildings. However, there are a number of reasons why this seems less likely on balance. Most of the postholes were relatively shallow and insubstantial, lacked clear packing stones, all the dated postholes are medieval or later, and they appear to respect the post-medieval ditch [137]. The vast majority of the postholes and stakeholes had soft grey-brown silt clay fills very similar to the topsoil, which would imply no great time-depth and no great antiquity.

The density of these features makes it very difficult to discern individual structures - if indeed recognizable structures are present - and it is possible that most, if not all, reflect regular but very short-term use of the site over a prolonged period. The $19^{\text {th }}$ century field names (Homer Fair Close and Fair Close) suggest a link to the great Penhale Fair, and it is entirely possible this scatter of postholes was generated by this annual use of the site.

Penhale Fair was a proverbial event: the early $19^{\text {th }}$ century Agricultural Survey of Cornwall (1811, 5960 ), in its discussion of the benefits of winter-sown wheat, states By Penhale-fair/Wheat should cover a hare. Prior to 1752 it was held on the $14^{\text {th }}$ September, but following the adoption of the Gregorian Calendar and the 'loss' of 11 days it was held on the $25^{\text {th }}$ September. It was a charter fair, established by royal charter, and is likely to have its origins in the $13^{\text {th }}$ century. There is clearly some historical confusion: Lysons (1814) states the parish of St Enoder had two charter fairs: Penhale Fair, and a fair held at a place called Long Chepyng [chepyng = derived from the ME chepynge 'long market square'], attached to the Manor of Polsue and held on Holyrood Day. However, an account roll for the Manor of Polsue lists revenue of the fair at Penhale, called Lanchepynfair among its incomes [CRO: AR/2/718], and Holyrood Day is the $14^{\text {th }}$ September. A series of $13^{\text {th }}$ century documents refer to rents payable at ad longam feriam or ad longas nundinas, the earliest of which is dated c. $1205 \times 9$ [CRO: AR/1/310]. This document, recording the gift of one acre [Cornish] at Rosewarrick in Lanivet, refers to fairs at both Bodmin and Penhale (ad longas nundinas), which in more recent accounts appear to have been conflated.

Its first recorded owner was John de Seneschall (c.1250-c.1308), the right passing by female heir to the Sergneuse family and then to the de Veres, Earls of Oxford, in 1396. During the $17^{\text {th }}$ century it passed to the Luttrells, and the grant of a fair was renewed by Oliver Cromwell as Lord Protector in 1658. This was to be held on Ascension Day (39 days after Easter) at Penhale, or between Longstone in the parish of St Enoder and the four boroughs in the parish of Gwennap [CRO: FS/3/1610]. Another
deed belonging to the estate of Francis Luttrell indicates Penhale Fair took place by grant at any place between longstone in ye parish of St Enedore [Enoder] \& ye four burroughs in ye parish of Gwinop [Gwennap] [CRO: AD2258/1/84]. This would imply the fair was originally itinerant and could be held at a place of its owner's choosing. The fair was moved to Summercourt in the early $18^{\text {th }}$ century, where it continues to be held.

If this is indeed one of the locations where Penhale Fair was held, it would be the first such site to be excavated on any scale and where evidence of use appears to survive. A review of the available literature on the subject would indicate that only a handful of similar sites across the country have been investigated, and none of these has produced any meaningful results. On the assumption this is a fair site, given the scale and apparent importance of Penhale Fair it is likely only a fraction of the site has actually been revealed. The concentration of postholes and stakeholes is therefore likely to reflect a zonation of activity within the fair.

The excavation at Penhale revealed elements of a Late Prehistoric and Romano-British fieldsystem coeval with the multivallate enclosure immediately to the east. The bulk of the features identified - a marked concentration of 230 postholes and stakeholes - probably date to the late or post-medieval period, and the documentary evidence would suggest they represent the remains of the great Penhale Fair, a royal charter fair that was held here from the $13^{\text {th }}$ century through to the $18^{\text {th }}$ century. It was then moved to Summercourt, and it is still held around the traditional date of the $5^{\text {th }}$ September. On balance, the many postholes on the site are likely to relate to these extremely shortlived but regular bursts of activity. The site at Penhale Farm is now the most extensively-investigated and best-preserved example of this poorly-understood and ephemeral class of site.
