#### 1. SUMMARY

A programme of systematic fieldwalking was undertaken on land at Northons Lane, Holbeach, Lincolnshire as part of planning requirements for development at the site.

This investigation revealed a single prehistoric artefact in the form of a worked flint dating to the Bronze Age. This was unexpected in this area, due to prehistoric levels being deeply buried, but it may have been brought to the surface by deep excavations or imported to the area more recently.

A small assemblage of Late Saxon to Saxo-Norman pottery was recovered predominantly from the southeast of the Site. A substantial assemblage of medieval material was widely distributed across the investigation area. Late medieval to early post-medieval material was also common. Late post-medieval to early modern material was concentrated along the eastern side of the New River Drain and represented domestic waste from nearby houses.

#### 2. INTRODUCTION

#### 2.1 Planning Background

Archaeological Project Services was commissioned by the Robert Doughty Consultancy, on behalf of Bovis Homes Group PLC, Lincolnshire County Council and Mr Goodley to undertake a fieldwalking survey totalling some 34ha on land at Northons Lane, Holbeach, Lincolnshire. This was in advance of proposed development of the area. The survey was carried out over five days between 9<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> February 2015.

#### 2.2 Topography and Geology

The site (centred approximately on NGR TF 34967 25303) is located either side of




Figure 2. Site location plan

Northons Lane, to the west of Holbeach in the South Holland district of Lincolnshire (Figs 1 and 2).

Local soils are of the Wisbech Series, typically coarse silty calcareous alluvial gley soils (Robson 1990). These soils are developed upon a drift geology of younger marine alluvium which in turn seals a solid geology of Upper Jurassic West Walton Formation mudstones (BGS 1992).

#### 2.3 Archaeological Setting

Evidence of prehistoric activity in Holbeach is scarce as the prehistoric land surface is believed to lie beneath several metres of marine alluvium.

As the Holbeach area's wetland began to stabilise in the Romano-British period, agricultural and salt-making practices were introduced.

It has been suggested that Northons Lane represents the probable Saxon coastline, the area south of the lane being inland (BGS 1992).

Holbeach is first mentioned in the Domesday Survey of c. 1086. Referred to as *Holobec*, *Holobech* and *Holebech*, the name is derived from the Old English and means the 'hollow (hol) back (bac)' (Cameron 1998, 64).

All Saints Parish Church, largely built in the 14<sup>th</sup> century by the Bishop of Lincoln replaced an earlier church, first referred to in AD 1177 (Macdonald, 1890, 19) lies approximately 1km southeast of the Site.

#### 3. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aim of the work was to gather sufficient information for the archaeological curator to be able to formulate a policy for the management of the archaeological resources present on the

site.

The objectives of the work were to:

- Establish the type of archaeological activity that may have been present within the site.
- Determine the likely extent of archaeological activity present within the site.
- Identify and date the archaeological artefacts present on the site.
- Determine the spatial arrangement of the archaeological artefacts present within the site.
- Determine the extent to which surrounding archaeological features extended into the application area.
- Establish the way in which the archaeological remains identified fitted into the pattern of occupation and land-use in the surrounding landscape.

#### 4. METHODS AND CONDITION

Fieldwalking was undertaken within the proposed development site at Northons Lane, Holbeach, Lincolnshire.




Figure 3 Site Layout and condition

The site comprised fields under arable cultivation. Two areas, the western part of the allotments and a field of cereal stubble immediately to the west, did not have conditions suitable for fieldwalking (Fig. 3).

The fields were walked in 20m transects by either two or three fieldwalkers. Visibility on the surface of the fields was reasonably good. The majority of the fields had been ploughed and were largely heavily ridged with the exception of the southwest part of the Site which had been ploughed and tilled and was fairly even (Fig. 3, Plates 2 & 3).

By the time of the fieldwalking, the snow cover had largely melted, remaining mostly in the plough furrows (Plate 1). This would have had a very minor effect in the visibility of surface artefacts.

Artefacts were collected, numbered and their locations recorded using a Sokkia GPS.

Following fieldwalking, finds were examined and a period date assigned where possible (Appendix 1).

#### 5. RESULTS




Figure 4 Prehistoric findspot

During the fieldwalking exercise, just over 550 items were retrieved. These range from prehistoric flint, to modern material including ceramics and glass. The finds distributions have been mapped by period (Figs. 4-10) and a summary archive discussion of the finds is presented as Appendix 2.

The detail of the finds material and distributions is presented in the discussion section, below.

#### 6. DISCUSSION

The earliest artefact identified during fieldwalking undertaken at Northons Lane, Holbeach, Lincolnshire was a flint side scraper of probable Bronze Age date.




Figure 5 Distribution of Saxo-Norman, medieval and late medieval-early post-medieval finds

Late Saxon to Saxo-Norman finds were scarce, comprising only 13 pieces dating from 10<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> century. The majority of the pieces were of Stamford Ware although three pieces of Thetford Ware were present. Although the quantity of the material was very small, the pieces were mostly located around The Old Cott and toward the south-eastern end of the Site (Fig. 5).

Medieval finds were represented mainly by utilitarian cooking jars and jugs. The ware, unsurprising considering the proximity of the Site to the kilns where it was produced. The majority was unglazed suggesting 12<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> century date. Later pottery from 13<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> century was represented by Toynton Ware. There were two main concentrations, one in the fields at the northwest of the site and the other around and to the south of The Old Cott (Fig. 5).




Figure 6 - Distribution of late medieval-early post-medieval, post-medieval and early modern finds

Late medieval to early post-medieval finds comprised predominantly Bourne 'D' Ware along with smaller quantities of various types. All were evenly distributed across the northwest and southeast of the Site (Figures 5 & 6).

Late post-medieval and early modern material was largely concentrated along the east side of the New River Drain, perhaps indicating changing patterns of land use (Fig. 6). Material consisted of domestic pottery waste with a small amount of ceramic building material. Clay pipe fragments were also recovered and were likely to have been quite locally made, perhaps in Spalding or King's Lynn.

#### 7. CONCLUSION

A programme of fieldwalking on land at Northons Lane, Holbeach, Lincolnshire, was undertaken to identify the potential presence of archaeological remains through the distribution of artefacts through the ploughsoil.

A single artefact of prehistoric date was recovered in the form of a flint side scraper. This is unusual as the prehistoric land surface around Holbeach is deeply buried by later alluvium. It is possible that this prehistoric artefact was brought to the surface by deep excavations, or was perhaps imported to, and deposited in the area at a much later date.

Late Saxon to Saxo-Norman artefacts were

scarce though exhibited some localisation, mainly occurring around the east side of the Site. Medieval material was abundant and widely distributed with denser areas, particularly to the south of The Old Cott.

Later medieval and early post-medieval material was fairly evenly distributed across the areas of finds concentration, whereas later post-medieval and early modern material was limited to the east side of the New River Drain.

Although there are locations where artefacts of different periods are more abundant than in other parts of the Site, the quantities of the material are pronounced and the clustering is not particularly distinct. In general, artefacts of medieval to modern date are more abundant in the south-eastern and northwestern parts of the Site. The greater abundance of material in the south-eastern part of the Site may be refuse discard, perhaps a manuring scatter, from the adjacent urban area of Holbeach. The source of the more abundant material in the north-western part of the Site is uncertain but may have derived from occupation around the present Distillery Farm, or the hamlet of Cackle Hill, a little to the north.

The most distinct distributional bias is in the early modern material, which is noticeably concentrated immediately east of the New River Drain in the north of the Site. It is not clear why this should be so, but may be due to the cleaning or the recutting of the drain.

#### Appendix 2

#### **HBNL15 - THE FINDS FROM FIELDWALKING**

#### **POTTERY**

By Alex Beeby

A total of 577 sherds of pottery were recovered during the Fieldwalking survey. All of the pottery has been identified and each piece has been assigned an individual pottery codename (Cname). All the Cnames used are in accordance with the Post Roman pottery type series for Lincolnshire, as published in Young *et al.* (2005).

Concentrations of pottery were recovered from two areas. The first of these was at extreme northwest area of the surveyed zone, bounded by Northon's lane to the south, the A151 road to the west and an area to the immediate east of the New River drain. The second area of concentration lay in the south eastern corner of the site running from the Old Cott at the north end and bounded by the areas of modern development in the south and east.

The intense concentrations of pottery dated from the Medieval to and Post Medieval period in these areas is striking and it is denser here than would be expected from a standard manuring scatter. There is no pottery dated to before the 10<sup>th</sup> century AD.

Late Saxon to Saxo-Norman (10<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup>)

There are 13 fragments within the assemblage of Later Saxon to Saxo-Norman date, with pieces likely to largely have been produced in the 10<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> centuries AD. This group includes three pieces of Thetford Type ware (THETT) and A further 10 of Stamford ware (ST). Stamford types include Late Saxon to Saxo-Norman fabrics E and A/D as well as typologically later Saxo-Norman to Early Medieval types B and/or C. These fabrics mostly occur in the area of finds concentration at the south eastern corner of the surveyed area.

Medieval (12th-14th)

Medieval fabrics are widely distributed, with particular densities in both the northern and southern areas of finds concentration, particularly to the south of the Old Cott. This is a group is substantial in size including at least 114 sherds, the dates of which, will have significant temporal overlap with the Stamford and Thetford wares listed above.

Types include at least 22 pieces of Early Medieval Handmade ware (EMHM) of 12<sup>th</sup> to mid 13<sup>th</sup> century date, 66 pieces of Bourne Medieval ware (BOUA) dated to the mid 12th to 14<sup>th</sup> centuries and 14 fragments of Toynton Medieval ware (TOY) manufactured from the Later 13<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> centuries. Other types include Ely Medieval ware (ELY), Grimston ware (GRIMT) and Peterborough Shelly ware (PSHW). Vessel types are largely utilitarian; comprising largely of cooking jars and jugs. The dominance of Bourne Medieval ware is unsurprising given the close proximity of the site to the kilns, although it is of note that a many of these vessels are apparently unglazed and some are even handmade, perhaps suggesting a bias towards the early period of Bourne production (Mid 12<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> centuries).

Later Medieval to Early Post Medieval (15<sup>th</sup> - Early to Mid 17<sup>th</sup>)

Pottery of this period is dominated by Bourne 'D' ware (BOU) (136 sherds), with smaller quantities of Glazed Red Earthenware (GRE), Cistercian ware (CIST) and Brown Glazed Earthenware (BERTH) as well as other common types. Pottery of this period is well distributed across both the areas of concentration, with additional pieces from across the site.

Later Post Medieval to Early Modern (Mid  $17^{th}$  -  $20^{th}$ )

Pottery of the later Post Medieval to Early Modern period is largely concentrated along the eastern side of the New River drain, with little recovered elsewhere. This is interesting and may indicate a change in land use during this time. In terms of fabrics, there is a wide range of types, including Black Earthenware (BL), Staffordshire Slip and White Salt Glazed wares (STSL, SWSG) and Pearlware (PEARL). Additionally, there are fragments from at least four Late Earthenware (LERTH) garden pots. This is probably domestic waste from nearby houses.

#### CERAMIC BUILDING MATERIAL

A total of just 36 fragments of ceramic building material were recovered. Most of this material is undatable or dated to the Post medieval to Early Modern period, including a high proportion of 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century types. There is just a single fragment of tile of definite Medieval date.

#### **OTHER FINDS**

By Gary Taylor

A variety of other finds were recovered, almost all of it post-medieval in date. There are 39 clay pipe fragments, a post-medieval type-fossil. Most of these are likely to have been manufactured fairly locally, perhaps in nearby Spalding or King's Lynn, though two have heel stamps of initials that do not represent known makers in either of those two towns.

There is little glass and all of it is post-medieval. There is also very little metal.

A quantity of stones and flint was recovered but almost all of this is natural, most of the flints being plough-struck flakes. There is, however, one prehistoric tool. This is a side scraper on a large struck flake and of probable Bronze Age date. In this fenland environment this is an unusual find, as the prehistoric horizons are generally deeply buried by later alluvial silts. Isolated items of Neolithic and Bronze Age date have been found at Holbeach previously, but they have been considered to be imports brought to the area later. However, it is possible that deep excavations, perhaps for field boundary or drainage ditches may have reached prehistoric levels and brought material from that period to the surface.

#### **GLOSSARY**

**Bronze Age** A period characterised by the introduction of bronze into the country for tools,

between 2250 and 800 BC.

Manuring Scatter A distribution of artefacts, usually pottery, created by the spreading of manure

and domestic refuse from settlements onto arable fields. Such scatters can provide an indication of the extent and period of arable agriculture in the

landscape.

**Medieval** The Middle Ages, dating from approximately AD 1066-1500.

**Modern** Relating to the 19<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> centuries.

**Post-medieval** The period following the Middle Ages, dating from approximately AD 1500-

1800.

**Prehistoric** The period of human history prior to the introduction of writing. In Britain the

prehistoric period lasts from the first evidence of human occupation about 500,000 BC, until the Roman invasion in the middle of the 1st century AD.

**Saxo-Norman** Pertaining to the period either side of the Norman Conquest of 1066, dating from

about 1000-1100 AD.
