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


Figure 1: General location (scale 1:25,000)

## Summary

During May 2006, Archaeological Services and Consultancy Ltd (ASC) undertook a watching brief at Little Hamstead, Little Hadham, Hertfordshire. The watching brief was required in advance of the construction of an all-weather tennis court and garden shed. Two visits were made to the site during which two archaeological features were observed.

## 1 Introduction

1.1 In May 2006 Archaeological Services and Consultancy Ltd (ASC) carried out a watching brief at Little Hamstead, Little Hadham, Hertfordshire (NGR TL 44178 21283: Fig. 1). The project was commissioned by Cowper Griffiths Architects, and was carried out according to a project design prepared by ASC (Semmelmann, 2006), and a brief (Tinniswood, 2006) prepared on behalf of the local planning authority (LPA), East Hertfordshire District Council, by their archaeological advisor (AA), Hertfordshire County Archaeology Office. The relevant planning application reference is 3/05/0818 & 3/05/2457.

### 1.2 Planning Background

This watching brief has been required as a planning condition under the terms of *Planning Policy Guidance Note 16* (PPG16), in response to proposals for the construction of an all-weather sports surface/tennis court and a garden shed.

#### 1.3 Location

The site lies on the south side of Acreman Street, which is located southeast of the village of Little Hadham, and links Hadham Ford and Bury Green.

#### 1.4 Description

The site is bounded on the south and the east by fields and by a track to the west. There is a dwelling to the southeast of the site with a driveway from Acreman Street leading up to it. The development area lies to the northwest of the site, away from any buildings where there is less likelihood of encountering services.

#### 1.5 Geology & Topography

The soils in the area belong to the *Melford Series*. They are described as *deep well-drained fine loamy over clayey, coarse loamy over clayey and fine loamy soils, some with calcareous clayey subsoils* (Soils Survey 1983). The site lies at an elevation c.97m AOD.

#### 1.6 Archaeological & Historical Background

The site lies within Area of Archaeological Significance No. 106 as designated in the Local Plan. This notes that there is evidence for Roman-British occupation in the area. Indeed, a Roman pottery kiln site is known at Clinton Farm to the east of the Little Hamstead (HER 1155), a possible farm has been identified to the southwest (HER 1396) and Romano-British coins and pottery have been found in the immediate area (HER 1394).

The Domesday Survey of 1086 records that William held 2 hides worth £4 at Little Hadham of the Bishop of London. The Abbot of Ely also held lands there, but instead of them lying within the Hundred of Odsey, as William's land did, his 4 hides lay in the Edwinstree Hundred. Ely Abbey had already held the lands prior to the Norman Conquest and saw their value rise from £12 in the reign of King Edward to £15 in 1086 (Williams & Martin 2002, 371, 375).

A castle is know to have stood in Caley Wood, to the west of Little Hamstead (HER 0797), and Clintons, which lies to the east, was a manorial site belonging to the Bishop of Ely (HER 2823).

## 2 Aims & Methods

#### 2.1 *Aims*

As described in the brief (Section 1), the aims of the watching brief were:

- To ensure the archaeological monitoring of all aspects of the development programme likely to affect archaeological remains
- To secure the adequate recording of any archaeological remains revealed by the development programme
- To secure the analysis, conservation and long-term storage of any artefactual/ecofactual material recovered from the site.

#### 2.2 Standards

The work conformed to the project design, to the relevant sections of the Institute of Archaeologists' *Code of Conduct* (IFA 2000) and *Standard & Guidance Notes* (IFA 2001), to the Association of Local Government Archaeological Officers East of England Region *Standards for Field Archaeology in the East of England* (ALGAO 2003), and to the relevant sections of ASC's own *Operations Manual*.

#### 2.3 Methods

The work was carried out according to the brief (Section 3), which required:

- Soil and overburden stripping under archaeological supervision
- Inspection of sub-soil deposits for archaeological features
- The rapid investigation and recording of any archaeological features/deposits
- Sub-soil stripping under archaeological supervision
- Examination of any service and foundation trenches and the subsequent recording of any exposed archaeological deposits
- Rapid examination of spoil-heaps for archaeological material
- A programme of post-fieldwork analysis, archiving and publication

## 3 Results and Conclusions

- 4.1 The footprint of the tennis court measures c.18m x c.38m, and slopes gently from north to south (Plate 1). The soil was removed to a depth of 0.6m at the northern end of the area, and 0.2m at the southern end. The natural subsoil consisted of a yellowish brown clay (Plate 2).
- 4.2 Two features were observed within the footprint of the proposed tennis court. The first was a sub-circular feature *c*.1.1m in diameter with a pale greyish brown fill that was located to the north of the court (Plate 4). The second comprised a thin L-shaped linear feature *c*.0.2m wide and *c*.14m in length, filled with greyish brown clay and located on the eastern side of the court. There is some burning located within the southern end of the linear feature (Plate 3).
- 4.3 No archaeological finds were made during the watching brief.

### 4.4 Archaeological impact of the development

The archaeological impact of this development is considered to be minimal. This is due to the fact that the archaeological remains are not extensive, and that the foundations of the court will not impact them in any way that will cause their destruction.

## 4.5 *Confidence Rating*

A high degree of confidence is attached to this watching brief. The weather conditions on the day of the site visit were overcast but wet, which will have resulted in any additional features present within the footprint of the tennis court being highly visible.


