Philip de Alta Ripa has part of the same manor as one-twentieth of a fee of the same William. p. 125, Warin de Muncheney holds half the Manor of Shrivenham, which was ancient demesne of the Earl Marshal, but for what service is not known. *ib.* Adam Sturmy has within the Manor the land which belonged to Robert le Fuer of the King's bailiff, but by what service is not known. p. 128, William le Graunt has 25s. and 4d. of land in Shrivenham of the King's gift with no service specified, which King Henry pr. gave to Roger the father of the aforesaid William. *ib.* the Abbot and Canons of Cirencester have half a hide of land for 5s. which is worth 8s., and it is not known who gave it. p. 129, John Bonvallet has one hide at Shrivenham for 10s. which used to be worth in money and services one mark, and so it was made by the bailiffs of the Manor of Shrivenham.
