HUNDRED OF PLOUGHLEY.

CHARLTON UPON STURE.

Imprimis ij Challices of Silver whereof one parcell guylt ; Item
ijij paire of vestments with their albes and Amyses ; one of green
silk, one of Blew satten, the thirde of red silke. Itm 2 copes, one
of greene silk, the other of blewe blanched damaske ; 2 Tunyxen of
white silk ; one paire of sensers ; one holly water pott of brasse ; iiij
greate belles and a sauncte bell.

HETHE.

In primis ij belles and a saunte bell in the steple ; ij small hand
belles and a litle sakering bell ; a Challes of silv^r parcell gilte ; a
vestment with the auble and Cope of Grene satten of bridges ; an
old vesture and a Cope ; a paire of latten Candlestickes ; a pair
of old sensers of latten ; a holly water stocke of latten.

BURCESTER.

In primis ij Chalices of silver whereof thone is gilte and thoþer
parcel gilte ; ij candlestickes of latten ; Five copes whereof ij of
them be of velvett and thoþers of old damask ; iiij vestment, one of
olde velvet and thoþers of old damaske with Albes to the same ; iiij
other vestments one of olde satten a bridges, the others of white
chamelot with albes to the same ; j sensure of latten ; fower belles
and a Sente bell in the steple.

MYDLETON.

Itm A challys of sylver persel gylt ; iiij payre of vestementes ;
one of blue vellat, one of Red vellatt, one of red satten of brygys
and one other of . . . silk ; one payre of sensers of brasse ; one
crose and the staffe of brass ; ij candlestickes of brass ; on holly
water stoke of brass ; iiij gret belles in the tower ; one sante bell and
ij hande belles.

ARDLEY.

Inprimis A Challice of silver parcell gilte ; a payre of sensers of latten ; ij holly water pot of bras ; ij belles hanging in the steple ; one sakeringe bell ; one cope of red satten.

HAMPTON GAYE.

Inprimis A Chalice parcel gilte ; one paire of vestments of branched blewe damaske ; a cope of blewe branched damaske ; a pair of old blew satten vestments ; one old grene vestment ; ij candlesticks of brasse ; iij litell sacring belles ; ij belles in the steple ; one holy water pot of brasse ; one ſencer of brasse.

FRINGEFORD.

Inprimis one Chalice of Silver ; one Cope of red Damask embrodered ; ij vestments on of red another of grene satten ; one crosse of lattyn and the staff of Lattyn ; ij Candlestickes of Lattyn ; a Senser of Latten ; iij belles and the saunte bell ; ij hand belles.

ODINGTON.

Inprimis a Chalice of silver parcel gylt ; A pixe of Iverie with small spanges* of silver ; a paire of sensers ; a Cope of red bridges Satten ; ij copies of old Darnyckes† ; a paire of vestmentes of white damaske ; Another sute of Tawney Satyn a Bridges ; ij other sutes of vestments of olde Dornyckes ; iij belles and ij hand belles.

FONTWELL.

Inprimis One Chalys of sylver parcel gylt ; a senser of Laten ; ij Cansticks of brasse ; one Cope of saten a bryges coloryd blewe ; ij pere of olde vestmentes ; one coloryd wyte and the other grene ; a holy water stocke of brasse ; iij belles and a saunce bell hannging in the stepull.

LAUNTON.

Inprims ij Crosses of Latten, one of them gilte ; one challys parsell gilte of silver ; fyve pere of vestmentes with albys, one of them of olde rede velvett and the other of saten a bryges ; iij Coppes one of them . . . redde velvet the other . . . ; iij Crewetts of tyne . . . ; iij belles in the stepull and the saunce bell.
