## The Mill of Richard Turnor of Binfield, co. Berks.

TN THE NAME OF the moost holye and blessed Trynytie the father the sonne and the holye goost by and vndre whome all creatures lif. I Richarde Turnor Remembred Inwardly that all people in this worlde been transitorye and have none abidinge therein certeyne willing therfor to dispose me in all thinges to the pleasure of god for the health of my Sowle asferfurth as by his assistaunce I can call to my Remembraunce the xth daye of September in the yere of our lorde god a thousaunde five hundred fiftie and eight beinge in health of body hole mynde and memorye wtout sicknes or desease thanked be his grace At Benfelde in the diocese of Sarum, make and ordeyne this my last will in maner and fourme followinge therby disanullinge all other willys by me heretofore made. Fyrst I bequeth my sowle to almightie god my maker and redemer, my bodie to be buryed in the Chappell of our ladye seynt mary in the parishe churche of all seyntes at Benfelde aforesaid vndre the stone there provided for the same if there I fortune to dye, and if in an other place then at the will of myne executres.

Also I begeuth to the churche of Sarum iijs. iiijd.

Also to the parsone of Benfelde for tithes negligently forgotten vis. viiid., and to the churche boxe there for my buriall xxs. alredy payed.

And also I will that there be given by myne executours to the pore people comynge to my buriall ijd. to every man, maide, wif, and childe, with mete breade and drynke plentie and sufficient to satisfie the number if yt then may conveniently be had and gotten, and that such obsequies and prayers be vsed as then shall be by the ordynnce of the churche taken admytted and thought beneficiall for the welth of my sowle and other my frendes departed this lif transitorie.

Also I will and bequeth to every householder dwelling in the parishe of Benfelde as well widowes as all other thought mete to take and receave almes for the relief of theym and theyre children xiid in new testrons made in the tyme of Kinge Edwarde to be payed to

theym the days of my burial wout deductinge of any part thereof, and at the monethes mynde to euery pore man, woman, and childe to have meate and drynke plentie w suche almes in money as myne executours shall thinke and see requysite in charitie to be given to the poore.

Also I give and bequeth to the Almesfolkes in Okingham and other poore nedy people in the Towne there Twentie shillinges. And further I give and bequeth to the mariages of xx poore maydes whiche shall hereafter be maryed in the parishe of Benfeld hurley or elsewhere at the discretyon of myne executours to euery mayde xxs. to be delyuered or paied the daye of theire mariage or before.

Also I give and bequeth to Grace Lovelace, widowe, my Basen of silver w<sup>t</sup> ewar and the greate gilt salt w<sup>t</sup> the cover nowe to her delyuered. I give also unto her xx li to reparell her and her children. And also I give and bequeth vnto the said Grace a cupborde or presse wherin is graven the picture of Adam and Eve, and the fetherbedd in the Chappell Chamber w<sup>t</sup> the hanginges and all thinges in the same beinge w<sup>t</sup> the Chappell stuff and hanging w<sup>t</sup> the longe carpett in the parlor, and the clothe wherein is the picture of dives and pauper paynted.

Also I give and bequeth to Richarde Lovelace my godson xx li in money and a gilt goblett  $w^t$  a cover.

Also I give and bequeth to Thomas Lovelace xx markes in money. Idem to John Lovelace xx markes in money.

Also I give and bequeth to Henry Lovelace twentie markes in money, and to Anthony Lovelace xx markes in money.

Also I give and bequeth to Elizabeth Lovelace xx li in money or golde. And further I will that if any of the aforesaid children dye afore theire legacies received or deliuered that theyre portions be equally departed to theym that over live.

And further I give and frely remytte vnto the forsaid John Lovelace and Grace his executrix the some of fiftie poundes, and also the some of one hundred poundes to the said John lent in ready money as by his wryting appeareth w<sup>t</sup> his owne hand.

The legacies to the children exiii li. vis. viiid. and money remytted a Hundred and fiftie poundes.

Also I will and bequeth to mistress Elizabeth Sandes, suster of John Sands,† gentilman, deceased, my little chalice, the Carpet of Turkey worke and the little masse boke whiche are now delyuered but the carpett yet remayneth.

Also I give and bequeth to Richarde Sandes my Godson twentie poundes in ready money or golde w<sup>t</sup> a globlett of sylver parcell gilt. Idem I give and bequeth to Margarett Sandes twentie markes in money w<sup>t</sup> a fetherbed in the little chamber over the hall, and the hanginges in the same.

Idem, I will and bequeth to Thomas Sandes xx markes in money.

Idem, to Anne Sandes twentie markes.

Also to marye Sandes twentie markes.

Also I give and bequeth to Grace Sandes now the wif of Humfrey Redynge xx markes which is already delyuered and payed.

And if any of the forsaid children dye after the delyuerye of theyre legacies the Supervisors of theym to have theire portiones among theym devided.

And further I frely give and remytt unto Henrye Sandes the some of c li, wherew he was chardged as his fathers executoure.

The somes given to the children aforsaid is Lxxxvi li. xiiis. iiijd.

And to the said Henrye remytted and given is c li.

Also I give and bequeth to Thomas Sampson, gentilman,
Vacat tenne pounde over and beside Lxiii ii. already to hym
mortuus. payed whiche I to hym frely remytt and forgive, and will
that tenne poundes be payed vnto hym at my death if he
then live.

Also I give unto Robert Sampson a great cruse garnysshed w<sup>t</sup> silver and gilt.

Idem I give to Turnor Sampson the trussinge bedde in the chamber over the hall w<sup>t</sup> all the apparell of the same, the hanginges there nowe beinge w<sup>t</sup> the hanginges in the somer parlor in the hall and wynter parlor w<sup>t</sup> all the table and fourmes beinge in the same excepte my greate folding table and the cupborde w<sup>t</sup> the newe coveryng.

Idem I will and bequeth to the said Robert Sampson my gowne furred wt conye skynnes, a doblett of damaske and a jakett wt all

such harnesse and billes as remayne in the hall not bequethed & one of my best mares. Also I give and bequeth to Turno<sup>r</sup> Sampson my godson xx li. in newe money, a greate goblett of sylver parcell gilt. And to Fraunces Sampson xx markes in money.

Also I give and bequeth to Grace Sampson my goddoughter xx marks a melche cowe and three silver Spones.

Idem I give to Mabell Sampson twentie markes in money and two silver spones.

Idem, I give and bequeth to Susanne Sampson fourtie povndes in newe money or golde, a cowe and six silver spones. And also I bequeth and give unto her the fetherbedd w<sup>t</sup> all thapparell and hanginges in the little chamber over the Seller.

Idem, to Margaret Sampson xx markes in money.

And further my mynde and full will is that if the said Thomas Sampson any thinge do or cause to be done by himself or any other his ffrendes in lett wtholding or disturbinge of myne executors in the due execution and performance of this my last will and testament other in cariage of any of my goodes corne or cattalls whatsoever to me belongeth. Then I will that all my legacies to hym given as aforsaid be clerely voyde in euery behalf as thoughe the same wtin this will were not mencyoned or expressed. And in like occasion so given as aforesaid the same Thomas also to be dischardged of my gift of the lease of Wellmores wt thoxen kyne to hym given by wrytinge. And in case no such like occasion as aforesaid by the said Thomas nor his frendes be not given then he and all his to have theire legacies aforsaid truely performed and delyuered wt thuttermost, and if any of the children dye the lyvers to have theire partes as aforsaid.

The legacies given to Mr. Sampson and his children over and besides the remyssion of the some of Lxiiii *li*. amounteth to the some of cxiii *li*. vis. viiid.‡

Idem, I also will and bequeth to Robert Sampson, gentilman, tenne poundes in ready money to be payed vnto hym ymmediately after my death and remytt and forgive vnto hym the some of fiftie

And also I further give and bequeth to the said Robert Sampsone the bedde wherein I lye over the wynter parlor wt the hanginges coverlett and all the apparell thereunto belonginge except a little cofer and a pictor of our ladie in the same chamber. And also I give and bequeth to the said Robert Sampson my chayne of fyne gold to be delyuered vnto hym by myne executours vnder such forme and condicion as hereafter ensueth and otherwise not. That is to saie, if the said Robert hereafter within the space of sixe yeres by his good demeanor and honest conversacon shall fortune eyther by his diligent service or other his true industre to obteyne vnto some welthy livings whereby it maye be seen to myne executours and overseers of this my will that he may lawfullie weare the said chayne other by reason of his seruice or other his substance truely come by or gotten, wtout thefte or robbery. Then I will that the same chayne be delyuered vnto hym as my gifte. And if the contrary of this condition be knowne and founde in the said Robert then I will and frely give the same to myne executor R. Oseley. And further I give and bequeth to the said Robert the lease and yeares yet enduringe in little Crofte, and give also vnto hym the best and greatest flight nett and polles wt roopes thereunto belonging wt a castinge nett for crowes and one other net for wylde geese and cranes.

Idem, I will and bequeth to Richard Sampson my godson twentie markes in money.

Also to Emlyn Sampson twentie markes in money wt the bedd and hanginges in the little chamber over the pantre.

Idem I bequeth and give to Katherine Sampson xx markes in money.

Also to Anne Sampson xx markes.

Idem to Elizabeth Sampson xx markes which is already delyuered and payed to her mistress.

Idem I bequeth to Grace Sampson xx markes and ffraunces Sampson xx markes, and if any of theym dye the livers to have theire partes. The legacies to the children of Simiyon Sampson ciij *li.* vis. viiid. and the sums remytted amounteth to Lxxx *li.* 

Idem I will and bequeth to my niece Hancocks and Margarett her doughter twentie poundes and a gilte Goblett wherein I have used dayly to drynke, and to my suster xxs. if she be living at the tyme of my death.

Idem I bequeth to Emlyne Bromley if any such be living tenne markes in money.§

Idem I will give and bequeth to Richarde Osely my cosyn and deputie in the Privie Seale a c li. in golde over and besides fourtie poundes that I have payed and delyuered vnto him at his desyre.

Also I give and bequeth vnto hym a greate Goblett parcell gilte w<sup>t</sup> the cover and a little gilt salt w<sup>t</sup> silver gilt and the cover.

Idem I give and bequeth to the forsaid Richarde all thinges beinge in my chamber at Westm' whiche he hath in his custodie.

Idem I also bequeth to the same Richarde my best gowne, my best doblett, my best Jakett and all my ffisshinge lynes and hokes for his pastyme hereafter.

The legacies to the forsaid Richarde extende to the some of CXL li.

Idem I give and bequeth to William Dobson XLs. if he live after my death, and if not then Richarde his son, my godson, to have the same, the some XLs.

Idem I give and bequeth to the iij clerks of the Privy Seale my fellowes iche of theym XLs. a man, this is vi li.

Idem I give and bequeth to Richarde Oseley my godson my best Rigynge cote and xls. and my nyght gowne wt remyssion and clere acquitaunce of all such somes of money as aforetyme I gave unto hym for his preferment, this is xls.

Item I will and bequeth to Richarde Woodwarde my olde negligent seruante tenne markes in money already paied and now at the time of my death fourtie shillinges (if he be living) a dooblett a payre of hoose, a flight net w<sup>t</sup> the polles, Roopes and all that thereunto and one horse colt or mare and a castinge nett for the goose or crane. This is XLS.¶

Idem I give and bequeth to Jone Roche\* ij Kyne whereof one is her owne wt her bedde and lodging in her chamber wherein she lieth, wt suche her stuff as to her belongeth. Also I give unto her a little pewter salt, viii pewter spoons, vi pewter dishes, vi sawcers, ii platters, a little Ketell and a table clothe wt a Towell and tenne markes in money which to her was by me delyuered and nowe further I give unto her xLs. to be paid vnto her at the tyme of my deth.

Also I give and bequeth to Elizabeth Blage x li. in new money whiche I have paied vnto her wt my nowne handes, and further now bequeth vnto her a lowe and a little compter table standing in the Cellar, a little salt of pewter and a little fetherbedde in my galary chamber w, the apparell belonging to the same, and further I give unto her a dozen of pewter spones, iii dyshes, iii sawcers wt one payre of shetes.

Idem I bequeth to Besse halet a cowe, a mattress wt all that is requisite therunto, and I give and bequethe vnto her vi li. xiiis. iiiid. to be delyuered vnto her at the tyme of my death or before at her marriage, a little panne or Ketill, ii pewter dishes and xii pewter spones, a payre of shetes, and a towell. This legacie is vi li. xiiis. iiijd. Idem I give and bequeth to John Cottrell my old seruante x markes in money whiche to hym is payed wt myne owne handes already, and I give also vnto hym the bedde wherein he lieth wt sperver & one younge bullock, one plowe wt cheynes and all that thereunto belongith, as share and cultur, one cart not shodde, the half of all my necessaryes in the workehouse, and one fflight net wt polles, and further I bequeth vnto hym if he conynue wt me in seruice at the tyme of my deathe fourtie shillinges and his waiges for that quarter. That is XLs. in money.

Idem I give and bequeth to marye my mayde xLs.‡ wt her quarters waiges towards her fyndynge vnto the tyme she maye haue a seruice wt meate and drinke after my deathe the space of one monethe wtn my howse according as yt is agreed betweene Mr. Sampson and me, and in satisfac'con thereof I gave vnto hym xx li. at his greate necessitie the fynding of his children and hym and thervpon faithfullie promysed that all my seruantes shulde if they so wolde contynue and remayne at my costes in meate and drinke win my howse for the space of one moneth after my death whiche I verely thinke he will perfourme accordingly.

Also I give and bequeth to Alice Dennys my mayde xLs. and her quarter waiges at the tyme of my deth.

Also I will and bequeth to Richard Slye¶ xLs. after my death wt one yonge mare colt xLs. And further I will that all such giftes or bequestes that I shall give vnto any persone or persones lienge vpon my death bedde shall be as well contented delyuered and

payed as if the same were given and wrytten win this my last will. Also I give and bequeth to my loving ffrende Edmunde Smythe gentilman xx ii. with my seconde gowne, seconde Jakett whome I have named and made one of myne executours. This as twentie poundes.

THE RESIDUE of all my goodes my dettes legacies and funeralles payed performed and done then as havinge respect to all my napery I will that the same be divided into thre partes wherof ij partes to my doughter Lovelace, and her children, the third parte to the children of Thomas Sampsone wt such bruenge vessels as are nowe in the brewenge howse also to be devided among theym and in like manner the brasse pewter and Iron that excepted whiche I have given to my seruantes, or shall give vpon my deth bedde to any of theym. And further I will that all my corne and catell not bequethed nor in my death bedd given shal be sold by myne executours and the money thereof comynge wt all such like ready money as shall happen to remayne shall be by myne executours distributed part of the same in mendinge of foule places nedeful in Wyngfelde lane, Hurley strete, and churche wayes in Benfelde.

And of this my last will and testament I ordeyne and make Richarde Oseley my Kynnesman, Edmund Smythe, gentilman, and Grace Lovelace, widowe, myne executours (if she lives), trusting that they will truely performe the same in euery behalf as I have all my lif trysted theym and so chardge theym as they will aunswere afore god at the daye of Judgement for the contrarye doynge.

And of this my wille ordeyne and make Overseers of the same my trustie ffrendes John Walle my kynnesman to whom I give and bequethe XLs. in money and my gowne lyned wt damaske. And also make my kynnesman and lovinge ffrende Robert Dale the other overseer to whome also I give and bequeth XLs. and my gowne furred wt blacke Budge.

Item I give and bequeth the bedd of Sarcenett in the greate chamber w<sup>t</sup> all th apparel of the same to my cosyn Ric. Oseley myne executo<sup>r</sup> and also to the same Richarde my lease and terme of yeares yet remayning in Welmores and other the landes in the same lease specified during the nonage of Turno<sup>r</sup> Sampsone my godson. And if yt fortune the same Turno<sup>r</sup> to live and accomplishe the full yeares of xxi<sup>tie</sup> then he to have the same lease. And for the more credite hereof to be given I have wrytten this will w<sup>t</sup> my rennynge hande and putte myn sigmanuell well knowne to many men. Theise witnesses Sir Robert ap Rice preist; Richard Malthouse; Robert

Sampson; Robert Dale, gentilmen; Richarde Woodwarde; John Cottrell and Richarde Slye my seruantes; Richarde Turnor; Robert Sampson; James Hale at Southey; George Cutteler; Thomas Cottrell.

This will was proved at London 11 Nov. 1558 by the oath of Christopher Robynson procurator for the executours named in the will.

An Inventory of all the bookes, vestimentes & other thinges belongyng to the Chyrche & Paryshe of Thame, made by John Manytorn & Thomas Buns & others, coproctours the xxv. day of Februarie MCCCCXLVII.

In Primis One Antiphone\* of ye gyfte of ye goode & worthey man William Kynnewlmerssh tresorer to oure lorde ye Kyng and some tyme Prebend of the prebendal chyrche of Thame, ye seconde folio begynnyng in black "Marie semper virginis."

Itm. of the gyfte of ye same worthey man ij Graduals, the first begynnyng on ye seconde folio in red "per totum" and ye seconde on ye seconde folio "Tuas domine."

It. of ye gyfte of ye same goode man ij processionalst. In ye seconde folio one begyns "A Deo," and the other on the seconde folio begyns "luminis dei."

Itm. Another processional, ye second folio begynnyng "Virtute sp's s'ti."
