Billingbear Park.

Having read the article on Billingbear in the last number of this Journal I thought it might be of interest to give some early extracts from the Close Rolls. They relate mainly to the period when the diocese, after the death of the Poitevin Bishop Peter des Roches in 1238, was in the King's hands, till William of Raleigh was appointed in 1244. I can find only one other reference to Billingbear in the Close Rolls, namely, in 1339.

The Bishop Adomar, who is stated in the Hundred Rolls of 1275-6 (4 E I) to have encroached on Billingbear, was Aymer de Valence, half brother of the King, who was forced upon the diocese by him. He was only in acolyte's orders and was never consecrated in England. He was elected November 4th, 1250, and I give the order to hand over all revenues of the diocese to him from January 16th, 125I.

He made himself so unpopular that he was driven out of the country in 1258, consecrated Bishop by the Pope at Rome in May, 1260, he died at Paris on December 4th, 1260.

The encroachment quoted on page 93 of the Journal as Sterling apparently by a clerical error appears in the 1275-6 H.R. as Sterling; other forms of the name are:—

It appertained to the Manor of Wargrave, but I have been unable to locate it.

Wydenstrode was not in Berkshire, but in Wilts, about six miles S.S.E. from Salisbury.

The Bishop of Winchester in 1339 was Adam of Orlton.
