

Appendix 2: Context descriptions

- [001] Linear ditch orientated north-west to south-east, 2.20m wide and in excess of 1.20m deep, with a sharp break of slope at top and bottom and an undeterminable base. Overall profile was irregular.
- (002) Medium brown silty clay, 2.20m wide and 0.20m in thickness, with moderate small rounded stones, medium charcoal fragments and pottery sherds. Tertiary fill of ditch [001].
- [003] Linear ditch orientated north-south, 0.60m wide and 0.20m in depth, with a sharp break of slope at top and gradual at base, concave base and a diffused U shaped profile.
- (004) Medium grey silty clay, 0.60m wide and 0.20m in thickness with infrequent pottery sherds, sheep and fish bones. Solitary fill of ditch [003].
- (005) Medium brown silty clay, 2.00m wide and in excess of 0.80m in thickness with moderate, medium sized charcoal fragments, sub-rounded chalk fragments, cattle, pig and fish bones and also pottery sherds and slag. Secondary fill of ditch [001].
- [006] Terminus of linear gully, orientated north-east to south-west, 0.80m wide and 0.20m in depth, with sharp break of slope at top and gradual at base, concave base and a U shaped profile. Small butt ended gully.
- (007) Medium green grey silt, slightly sessy looking, 0.80m wide and 0.20m in thickness with occasional pottery sherds and cbm fragments. Solitary fill of [006].
- (008) Medium reddish brown clay, 1.00m wide and in excess of 0.20m in thickness, with frequent sub-rounded chalk fragments. Possible re-deposited natural.
- (009) Light brown clay with occasional sub-rounded chalk fragments. In excess of 0.20m in thickness and covers the entire area of the investigated trench and can be seen across some areas of the site showing through the modern overburden.
