Tile Archive for The Manor House, Thorpe in Bolne, South Yorkshire (TIB08)

A small assemblage of two fragments of ceramic roof tile was recovered from the site. One of the fragments survives as a thin flake and cannot be closely dated. The other corner fragment, is of medieval type (mid 12th to 15th century). Neither fragment has a fabric especially typical of the local area. The material should be retained for possible future study as part of any ceramic building material type series.
