A small group of pottery dating from the Medieval to early modern period was submitted for examination. The assemblage includes a range of local, regionally imported and continentally imported vessels including earthenwares, slipwares and stonewares. Vessel types include the common forms of jugs, jars and bowls as well as more unusual forms such as drinking jugs and pipkin/cooking pots. This group is similar in composition to other assemblages recovered from Boston with the exception of an unusual slipware vessel found in 310. The material is in a stable condition and should be kept for future study.

Appendix 5 Whitehorse Lane, Boston, Lincolnshire (WLBL 09) The Animal Bone By Jennifer Wood

Introduction

A total of 4 (205g) fragments of animal bone were recovered by hand during archaeological works undertaken by Pre-Construct Archaeology Services at Whitehorse Lane, Boston, Lincolnshire. The remains were recovered from make-up layers (209) and (439) both provisionally dated from the Post-Medieval period.

Results

The remains were generally of a good to moderate overall condition, averaging grades 2 - 3 on the Lyman criteria (1996). No evidence of burning, gnawing or pathology was noted on the remains.

A single Sheep/Goat femur shaft recovered from (209) displayed butchery evidence consistent with meat removal cut marks.
