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SUMMARY

An archaeological watching brief was undertaken by Cotswold Archaeology during groundworks associated with the creation of an irrigation reservoir at Birchwood Park Golf Centre, Dartford, Kent. Stonehill Farm, which lies to the immediate north-east of the new reservoir site, formed part of the Stonehill Green post-medieval farm complex.

No features or deposits of archaeological interest were observed during groundworks, and no artefactual material pre-dating the modern period was recovered. This indicates that any below-ground remains associated with Stonehill Green Farm do not extend as far as the new reservoir footprint. This result is consistent with the site having been woodland in the post-medieval period, as indicated by late 19th-century cartographic sources. There was no evidence for earlier activity at the site.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 In September 2013, Cotswold Archaeology (CA) carried out an archaeological watching brief for Savills on behalf of Burhill Golf and Leisure Ltd at Birchwood Park Golf Centre, Dartford, Kent (centred on NGR: TQ 5025 7019; Fig. 1). The watching brief was undertaken to fulfil a condition attached to planning consent granted for the creation of an irrigation reservoir (planning ref: DA/12/01443).
- The watching brief was carried out in accordance with a specification (Kent County Council 2013) prepared by Wendy Rogers, Senior Archaeological Officer for Kent County Council Heritage Conservation Group, the archaeological advisors to Dartford Borough Council (DBC; the local planning authority). The watching brief was also in line with a subsequent detailed written scheme of investigation (WSI) produced by CA (2013) and approved by DBC acting on the advice of Wendy Rogers.
- 1.3 In addition, the watching brief followed the Standard and Guidance for an Archaeological Watching Brief (IfA 2009), the Management of Archaeological Projects 2 (English Heritage 1991) and the Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (MORPHE): Project Manager's Guide (English Heritage 2006).

The site

- 1.4 The monitored area covered approximately 1ha and was within the bounds of Birchwood Park Golf Centre (Fig. 2), which lies to the west of Birchwood Road, some 5.3km south-west of central Dartford. At the time of the watching brief, the site comprised an area of grassland from which a light tree covering had recently been removed.
- 1.5 The underlying bedrock geology of the site is mapped as Thanet Sand Formation. Where recorded, the superficial deposits are mapped as Head clays, silts, sands and gravels (BGS *Geology of Britain Viewer* website).

Archaeological background

1.6 Stonehill Farm, which lies to the immediate north-east of the new reservoir site, formed part of the Stonehill Green post-medieval farm complex.

1.7 Late 19th-century Ordnance Survey maps show the new reservoir site as managed woodland to the south-west of the farm complex. This woodland had been partially cleared by the 1930s and was largely removed by the 1960s (*Old Maps* website).

Archaeological objectives

- 1.8 The objectives of the archaeological works, as outlined in the WSI (CA 2013), were to:
 - monitor the development groundworks, and to identify, investigate and record any significant buried archaeological deposits revealed at the site;
 - produce an integrated project archive;
 - produce a report setting out the results of the project and the archaeological conclusions that can be drawn from the recorded data.

Methodology

- 1.9 The fieldwork followed the methodology set out within the WSI (CA 2013). An archaeologist was present during intrusive groundworks, which comprised the machine-stripping of the new reservoir footprint (Fig. 2).
- 1.10 Written, graphic and photographic records were compiled in accordance with *CA Technical Manual 1: Fieldwork Recording Manual* (2007).
- 1.11 The watching brief archive is currently held by CA at their offices in Milton Keynes, prior to deposition with Dartford Borough Museum. A summary of information from this project, as set out within Appendix B, will be entered onto the OASIS online database of archaeological projects in Britain.

2. RESULTS

- 2.1 See Appendix A for detailed descriptions of all recorded contexts.
- 2.2 The natural geological substrate (103) comprised yellow-orange clay and was revealed at an average depth of 0.45m below the present ground level (Fig. 3). It was overlain by 0.15m of clayey silt subsoil (102), which was sealed in turn by up to 0.3m of topsoil/turf (101/100).

2.3 No features or deposits of archaeological interest were observed during groundworks and, despite visual scanning of spoil, no artefactual material pre-dating the modern period was recovered.

3. DISCUSSION

- 3.1 Despite the archaeological potential of the application area, the watching brief identified no archaeological remains within the area of observed groundworks.
- 3.2 The absence of archaeological deposits indicates that any below-ground remains associated with the Stonehill Green post-medieval farm complex do not extend as far as the new reservoir footprint. This is consistent with the site having been woodland in the post-medieval period, as indicated by late 19th-century cartographic sources. There was no evidence for earlier activity at the site.




