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#### **SUMMARY**

In July 2014, Cotswold Archaeology carried out an archaeological watching brief at Whitchurch Reservoir, near Whitchurch, Buckinghamshire. The work, which was commissioned by Thames Water Utilities Ltd, was undertaken during groundworks associated with improvement works to the reservoir infrastructure. No archaeological deposits or features were encountered within the site and no archaeologically significant artefacts were noted in the excavated spoil.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 In July 2014, Cotswold Archaeology (CA) carried out an archaeological watching brief at Whitchurch Reservoir, near Whitchurch, Buckinghamshire (site centred on NGR: SP 8013 1988; Fig. 1). The work, which was commissioned by Thames Water Utilities Ltd (TW), was undertaken during groundworks associated with improvement works to the reservoir infrastructure.
- 1.2 The watching brief was requested by Claire Hallybone, TW's Senior Archaeologist (TWSA), as the site is located in an area of archaeological potential. This is in compliance with TW's Code of Practice and in line with the National Planning Policy Framework (DCLG 2012). A Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) was prepared for the works by CA (2014).
- 1.3 The project was carried out in accordance with the WSI, the Institute for Archaeologists' Standard and Guidance for Archaeological Watching Briefs (IfA 2008) and the English Heritage procedural documents Management of Archaeological Projects 2 (EH1991) and Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (MoRPHE): Project Manager's Guide (EH 2006).

#### The site

- 1.4 The site is located *c.* 600m to the south of the village of Whitchurch, in the parish of Whitchurch, approximately 6km to the north of Aylesbury town centre (Fig. 1). The proposed works were carried out in the south-west corner of a pasture field, adjacent to a pumping station that is accessed via a single-track road leading off the A413 to the east (Fig. 2).
- 1.5 The ground slopes gradually to the west, into the valley of a small stream, a minor tributary of the River Thame, and lies at an average height of *c.* 95m above Ordnance Datum (aOD).
- 1.6 The solid geology of the site comprises Jurassic mudstone of the Kimmeridge Clay Formation, with mudstone of the Ampthill Clay Formation outcropping on the lower ground to the west of the site, in the base of the tributary valley (BGS 2014).

#### Archaeological background

1.7 There are no known archaeological sites within the area of the proposed works, although the Buckinghamshire Historic Environment Record (HER) contains three records of archaeological sites in the vicinity and the site lies close to the historic core of the village of Whitchurch. The records refer to a possible Roman and Saxon burial ground, said to be located in the north outer bailey of the castle, *c.* 600m to the north of the site, and approximately 500m to the north-east is the site of a former watermill, now a private residence. A windmill was located near the mill, but this was dismantled and moved to a new location in the 19th century.

# Archaeological objectives

- 1.8 The objectives of the archaeological works, as outlined in the WSI (CA 2014), were:
  - to monitor groundworks, and to identify, investigate and record all significant buried archaeological deposits revealed on the site during the course of the development groundworks;
  - at the conclusion of the project, to produce an integrated archive for the project work and a report setting out the results of the project and the archaeological conclusions that can be drawn from the recorded data.

#### Methodology

- 1.9 The fieldwork followed the methodology set out within the WSI (CA 2014). An archaeologist was present during all intrusive groundworks in the area shown in Figure 2. This comprised the stripping of topsoil over an area of pasture measuring approximately 13m by 30m (Figs. 3 and 4).
- 1.10 Written, graphic and photographic records of the deposits encountered were compiled in accordance with CA's *Technical Manual 1: Fieldwork Recording Manual* (2013). There were no finds and no deposits were encountered that were suitable for palaeoenvironmental assessment.
- 1.11 The archive from the watching brief, currently held by CA at their offices in Newport Pagnell, will be deposited with Buckinghamshire Museum Service. A summary of information from this project, as set out within Appendix B, will be entered onto the OASIS online database of archaeological projects in Britain.

#### 2. RESULTS

- 2.1 The geological substrate was mid yellowish-brown clay with patches of greyish-blue clay. This was sealed by dark greyish-brown humic sandy silt topsoil, approximately 0.18m thick (Fig. 4).
- 2.2 No archaeological features were present within the monitored area and no archaeologically significant artefacts were observed during visual scanning of the excavated topsoil. The only notable feature was the modern service trench for the existing water main.

#### 3. DISCUSSION

3.1 There were no archaeological features or deposits within the monitored area and no archaeologically significant artefacts were observed during visual scanning of the excavated topsoil.




