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SUMMARY

An archaeological watching brief was undertaken by Cotswold Archaeology during groundworks associated with the relocation of an existing fence at 2, Abbey Cottages, Abbey Precinct, Church Street, Tewkesbury, Gloucestershire.

No features or deposits of archaeological interest were observed during the groundworks.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 On 1 July 2015 Cotswold Archaeology (CA) carried out an archaeological watching brief for Mr R Bellairs at 2, Abbey Cottages, Abbey Precinct, Church Street, Tewkesbury, Gloucestershire (centred on NGR: SO 8894 3237 Fig. 1). The watching brief was undertaken to fulfil conditions attached to Scheduled Monument Consent (SMC) granted by English Heritage (now Historic England) for the relocation of an existing fence to provide a parking area (SMC ref. S00103502).
- 1.2 The watching brief was carried out in accordance with a detailed Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) produced by CA (2015) and approved by Hugh Beamish, Inspector of Ancient Monuments, Historic England. The fieldwork also followed Standard and guidance: Archaeological watching brief (ClfA 2014), the Management of Archaeological Projects 2 (English Heritage 1991) and the Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (MORPHE): Project Manager's Guide (English Heritage 2006).

The site

- 1.3 Abbey Cottages is situated 80m south-west of Tewkesbury Abbey, close to the Abbey Gate. It is bound by Church Street and Abbey Precinct to the northwest and northeast respectively, by gravel hardstanding to the southeast and gardens to the southwest.
- 1.4 The underlying bedrock geology of the area, mapped as Mudstone and Limestone of the Carboniferous period (BGS 2015), was not observed during the current work.

2. ARCHAEOLOGICAL BACKGROUND

2.1 The development area lies in an area of archaeological significance within part of a Scheduled Monument; Site of St Mary's Abbey (National Monument 21704). The monument includes the known area of the main precinct of the Benedictine Abbey of St Mary's and the earlier 8th-century priory. The history of the monument is comparatively well documented. A priory was founded here by the end of the 8th century. In 980 AD the Benedictine cell at Tewkesbury was subordinated to Cranborne Abbey in Dorset and it was 1102 before the abbey was re-founded in Tewkesbury. This abbey was consecrated in 1123 and dissolved in 1540. The

Scheduled area also contains a number of listed buildings including Nos. 1, 2 and 3 Abbey Cottages.

3. AIMS AND OJECTIVES

- 3.1 The objectives of the archaeological works were:
 - to monitor groundworks, and to identify, investigate and record all significant buried archaeological deposits revealed on the site during the course of the development groundworks;
 - at the conclusion of the project, to produce an integrated archive for the project work and a report setting out the results of the project and the archaeological conclusions that can be drawn from the recorded data.

4. METHODOLOGY

- 4.1 The fieldwork followed the methodology set out within the WSI (CA 2015). An archaeologist was present during intrusive groundworks, comprising the hand excavation of nine postholes, each typically measuring 0.3m by 0.3m in plan and 0.6m in depth (see Fig. 2 for locations and extent).
- 4.2 Written, graphic and photographic records were compiled in accordance with CA Technical Manual 1: *Fieldwork Recording Manual*.
- 4.3 The archive from the watching brief, which is currently held by CA at their offices in Kemble, will be deposited with the Cheltenham Museum and Art Gallery. A summary of information from this project, set out within Appendix B will be entered onto the OASIS online database of archaeological projects in Britain.

5. RESULTS

An analogous stratigraphic sequence was identified within each of the excavated postholes. The earliest deposit encountered was a modern topsoil, typically revealed 0.2m below the present ground level. This deposit was at least 0.4m in depth, being observed to the formation level in each of the postholes, and was overlain by a sand and gravel levelling layer for the existing paved surface.

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5.2 No features or deposits of archaeological interest were observed during the groundworks. A small number of unstratified post-medieval/ modern artefacts were recoevered from the topsoil deposits but were not retained.

6. DISCUSSION

6.1 Despite the archaeological potential of the application area (see archaeological background above), the watching brief identified no archaeological features or deposits within the area of observed groundworks. The presence of a topsoil deposit in excess of 0.4m in depth suggests a former horticultural use within the current area prior to the construction of the modern paving.


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
