An archaeological watching brief was undertaken by Cotswold Archaeology during groundwork associated with the construction of nine dwellings at Land to the Rear of Blossoms, Wychwood, Holt Leigh and April Cottage, Back Lane, Bucks Horn Oak, Farnham, Hampshire.

No features or deposits of archaeological interest were observed during the groundwork programme, and no artefactual material pre-dating the modern period was recovered.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 In November 2017 Cotswold Archaeology (CA) carried out an archaeological watching brief for CgMs Consulting Ltd on behalf of Metis Homes at Land to the Rear of Blossoms, Wychwood, Holt Leigh and April Cottage, Back Lane, Bucks Horn Oak, Farnham, Hampshire (centred at NGR: 480543 141815; Figure 1). The watching brief was undertaken to fulfil a condition attached to a planning consent for the construction of nine dwellings (Planning ref: SDNP/13/05902/FUL).
- 1.2 The watching brief was carried out in accordance with a detailed *Written Scheme of Investigation* (WSI) produced by CA (2017) and approved by Neil Adam, Senior Archaeologist for Hampshire County Council (HCC), Archaeological Advisor to the South Downs National Park Authority (SDNP). The fieldwork also followed Standard and guidance: Archaeological watching brief (ClfA 2014) and HCC's Archaeology and Planning: Guidance for Contractors (HCC 2013).

The site

- 1.3 The development area measures approximately 0.44ha, and currently comprises pasture sloping from 120m above Ordnance Datum (aOD) in the west down to 117m in the east. The site is rectangular with a trackway leading off to the east linking the site with Back Lane.
- 1.4 The underlying bedrock geology of the area is mapped as the Gault Formation Mudstone. This is Sedimentary Bedrock formed approximately 100 to 112 million years ago in the Cretaceous Period. The Local environment would previously have been dominated by shallow seas.

2. ARCHAEOLOGICAL BACKGROUND

2.1 Although the site lies with in a general area of archaeological interest, (both Roman and prehistoric remains having been recorded in the wider landscape), recent developments in close proximity to the site revealed no evidence of archaeological activity.

3. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- 3.1 The objectives of the archaeological works were:
 - to monitor groundworks, and to identify, investigate and record all significant buried archaeological deposits revealed on the site during the course of the development groundworks;
 - at the conclusion of the project, to produce an integrated archive for the project work and a report setting out the results of the project and the archaeological conclusions that can be drawn from the recorded data.

4. METHODOLOGY

- 4.1 The fieldwork followed the methodology set out within the WSI (CA 2017). Although informed a little tardily, an archaeologist was subsequently present during the majority of overburden strip (across much of the proposed footprint) to natural (Figure 2).
- 4.3 The archive and artefacts from the evaluation are currently held by CA at their offices in Andover. Subject to the agreement of the legal landowner site archive will be deposited with Farnham Museum. A summary of information from this project, set out within Appendix B, will be entered onto the OASIS online database of archaeological projects in Britain.

5. RESULTS (FIGURES 2-3)

No features or deposits of archaeological interest were observed within the natural (which comprised red/brown silt/clay) during the groundwork programme. The spoil heaps were also scanned for finds but none were identified which pre-dated the modern period.

6. DISCUSSION

6.1 Despite the archaeological potential of the wider area of the site (see archaeological background above), the watching brief identified no archaeological remains within the area of observed groundwork. The absence of archaeological deposits within the site correlates with the results of previous archaeological works within the immediate vicinity of the site.


