Introduction

In August 2018, Cotswold Archaeology carried out an archaeological evaluation on land at Borough House, Lifton (Fig. 1). These works were undertaken for Mr and Mrs Mounce.

Archaeological background

An Iron Age or Roman hillfort has been identified in Lifton Wood (c. 300m south of the evaluation site) from aerial photographs. The evaluation site is located within the historic core of Lifton, which was founded prior to the 9th century. The site borders onto the churchyard of the Grade I Listed Church of St. Mary the Virgin (Historic England list no. 1317823) to the east, which was founded in the 12th century.

Map regression

The Lifton Tithe Map (1840) shows the majority of the site within an irregularly shaped plot to the south and south-west of Borough House. The site is described as an orchard in the accompanying apportionment. The northern part of the site is shown as being within a small garden to the immediate west of Borough House.

The Ordnance Survey (OS) map of 1884 shows little change, though two small ancillary structures are depicted at the eastern boundary of the site, and another in its south-western corner. A yard, partially surrounded by structures, is shown within the northernmost part of the site. The OS map of 1953 shows an expansion of Borough House into the yard and garden in the northern part of the site. A trackway is depicted running across the site from Borough House to a cluster of small structures in the east of the site.

The OS map of 1966 shows a structure in the centre of the southern plot of the site, within the orchard. The OS map of 1988 shows the majority of the southern part of the site continuing in use as an orchard, although the central structure had been removed by this point. With the exception of the main barn and yard currently in the centre of the site, the present layout of the site was in place by 1988.

Methodology

The evaluation followed the methodology set out in the Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI; Cotswold Archaeology 2018) and comprised the excavation of four trenches (Fig. 2). There was some variance from the trench plan proposed in the WSI in order to avoid overhead services.

Results (Figs. 2 & 3)

The natural substrate comprised mid orangey brown sandy clay and was exposed 0.34m–0.71m below present ground level. The natural substrate was overlain by 0.24m–0.49m of clayey silt subsoil. The subsoil layer in T1, T2 and T4 was overlain by 0.2m of modern topsoil; the subsoil in T3 was overlain by 0.1m of hardcore, forming a yard. Two features were recorded, each of which was cut into the subsoil layer:

Tree throw 204 (T2) was 1.2m in diameter and 0.14m in depth. It contained a burnt clay and charcoal-rich fill (205) that appeared to have been burnt *in situ*. No finds were retrieved from this deposit.

Ditch 103 (T1; Fig. 3, Sec. AA) was oriented east-north-east/west-south-west and was gently curved in plan. This ditch was 0.58m wide and 0.2m deep, with a single undated fill (104).

Finds

A total of four sherds of North Devon gravel-tempered ware were recovered from the subsoil. Three of these sherds were recovered from subsoil 101 (T1) and are base sherds from a single vessel. A bowl rimsherd was recovered from subsoil 201 (T2). The fabric dates to the 17th–18th centuries (Allan 1984).

Discussion

The archaeological works recorded a burnt-out tree throw and a shallow ditch in the southern part of the site. Although undated artefactually, these features were cut into the subsoil layer, from which 17th/18th century pottery was recovered. The three throw is most likely related to the orchard that is known to have been present at the site in the 19th and 20th centuries. It is likely that the ditch is also related to the orchard, judging by its stratigraphic position, although it is not depicted on any consulted historic map.




Trench 1 overview, looking north-east (1m scales)
