Introduction

In January 2020, Cotswold Archaeology carried out an archaeological evaluation at Post Hill, Tiverton Devon (Fig. 1). This evaluation was undertaken for Burrington Estates Ltd. It was carried out in response to a draft planning condition associated with a planning application for the demolition of existing buildings and subsequent residential development of the site.

Archaeological background

The following text is summarised from the Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI; CA 2020). Several prehistoric archaeological sites are known in the vicinity, including a Neolithic long barrow (*c*. 170m north of the proposed development site), a series of Neolithic pits (*c*. 360m south-west of the proposed development site) and a Middle Bronze Age cremation (*c*. 330m south-west of the proposed development site). A sub-square Roman enclosure with a possible burial in its centre has also been excavated some 430m north-east of the proposed development site.

The Tiverton Joint Hospital was established at the site at the turn of the 20th century. Historic cartographic sources depict several associated buildings, some of which have subsequently been demolished.

Methodology

The evaluation followed the methodology set out in the WSI (CA 2020). A total of nine trenches was excavated (Fig. 2). All trenches were *c*. 10m long and 1.8m wide. There was some variation from the trench plan proposed in the WSI in order to avoid underground services and due to access constraints.

Results (Figs. 2 & 3)

The natural substrate comprised brown-red silty clay with occasional shillet inclusions. It was exposed in all trenches at a depth of 0.4m–0.6m below the present ground level. It was generally sealed by colluvium layers which were covered in turn by the modern topsoil, although in T6 the natural substrate was sealed directly by the topsoil.

A modern field drain was encountered in T8 and T9. A series of modern brick walls and a concrete surface were identified in T2 and T3.

Discussion

None of the trenches contained archaeological features or deposits. No evidence for truncation was observed. This indicates that the prehistoric and Roman activity recorded in the vicinity of the site did not extend as far as the site itself.

The modern walls and surface revealed in T2 and T3 are similar in construction to the extant hospital buildings at the site. They are in the location of (and are on the same alignment as) a former hospital building depicted on Ordnance Survey mapping from 1905 to 1993.




