Introduction

In August 2020, Cotswold Archaeology carried out an archaeological watching brief at 6 New Cut, Cullompton, Devon (Fig. 1). The watching brief was commissioned by Devon Property Partnership and was undertaken to fulfil a condition of planning before residential development of the site.

Archaeological background

Approx. 860m north of the site excavations in advance of the construction of the Health Centre on Willand Road on revealed both late prehistoric and Romano-British features, including a curvilinear gully and number of pits. Approx. 400m north-west of the site a possible prehistoric/Romano-British field system and a series of archaeological features north of Tiverton Road were recorded during excavations in 2010.

The Roman forts and camps on St. Andrew's Hill are located approx. 420m north of the site. This substantial asset was first identified through aerial photography in 1984, and its presence subsequently confirmed by geophysical surveys and excavations in the 1990s. Archaeological investigations revealed the presence of two Roman forts on St Andrew's Hill, constructed between AD 50 and AD 70 and abandoned by c. AD 75.

The excavation at the Willand Road Medical Centre revealed part of a late Iron Age and early Roman rural settlement, with several penannular (roundhouse) gullies and enclosure ditches. A similar settlement was excavated at Knowle Lane, which was again probably occupied in the early Roman period.

North of the site (approx. 900m) excavations adjacent to Willand Road revealed both prehistoric and Romano-British features, including field boundaries, three sub-rectangular enclosures, part of a circular enclosure and possible post-holes. Northwest of the site (approx. 470m) a possible prehistoric – Romano-British field system and a series of archaeological features north of Tiverton Road were recorded during excavations in 2010. A number of artefact scatters to the immediately to the south and southwest, located at Knowle Lane and within the gardens of the Walronds have included Romano-British finds.

Methodology

The watching brief followed the methodology set out in the Written Scheme of Investigation (Cotswold Archaeology 2020). An archaeologist was present during the excavation of intrusive groundworks associated with the proposed development (Fig. 2).

Results (Figs. 2 & 3)

The monitored groundworks identified a series of made ground layers to a depth of 0.5m below the present ground level. These made ground deposits contained modern finds that were noted but not retained. Existing services and drains were also identified. The natural substrate was not encountered in any of the monitored groundworks, that were halted at a depth of 0.5m below the present ground level.

Discussion

Despite the archaeological potential of the site, the watching brief identified no archaeological remains within the observed groundworks. The modern made ground deposits identified across the site seem to indicate that, if present, archaeological features could have been removed by later activity although it is also possible that archaeological remains could still be present at a greater depth.




