An archaeological watching brief was undertaken by Cotswold Archaeology during groundworks associated with the extension of The Old Vicarage, Taynton, Oxfordshire. The watching brief was undertaken on the behalf of Mrs Alexandra Lloyd.

No features or deposits of archaeological interest were observed during groundworks, and no artefactual material pre-dating the modern period was recovered.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 In December 2007 Cotswold Archaeology (CA) carried out an archaeological watching brief for Mrs Alexandra Lloyd at The Old Vicarage, Taynton, Oxfordshire (centred on NGR: SP 2341 1371; Fig. 1). The watching brief was undertaken to fulfil a condition attached to a planning consent for the extension of The Old Vicarage and the construction of a new swimming pool (Planning ref: 07/1682/P/FP). The objective of the watching brief was to record all archaeological remains exposed during the development. To date the works have comprised the construction of the extension to the rear of the property only and the construction of the swimming pool has been postponed.
- 1.2 The watching brief was carried out in accordance with a detailed archaeological brief prepared by Hugh Coddington, Deputy County Archaeological Officer, Oxfordshire County Council (OCC), the archaeological advisor to West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC) and with a subsequent detailed Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) produced by CA (2007) and approved by WODC acting on the advice of Hugh Coddington. The fieldwork also followed the *Standard and Guidance for an Archaeological Watching Brief* issued by the Institute of Field Archaeologists (2001) and the *Management of Archaeological Projects* (English Heritage 1991).

The site

- 1.3 The site is bounded to the south-west by the unclassified road running between Burford and Taynton and on the remaining sides by further residential properties and gardens (Fig. 2). The site lies at approximately 110m AOD, with the ground dropping downward to the south.
- 1.4 The site comprises an area of approximately 540m² and contains the residential property together with areas of hard-standing and parts of the garden.
- 1.5 The underlying solid geology of the area is mapped as Marlstone Rock Formation of the Jurassic era (BGS 1998). This was encountered during the groundworks.

Archaeological background

1.6 Archaeological interest in the site arises not only from the status of The Old Vicarage as a Grade II listed building dating to the 18th century but also its location within the historic core of Taynton. The village is mentioned in the Domesday Survey of 1086 implying a late Saxon or Norman origin at the latest and cartographic data demonstrates that the form of the village has changed very little over time. The nearby church of St John dates to the 14th century and Romano-British pottery has also been found in its vicinity (OCCAS 2007).

Methodology

- 1.7 The fieldwork followed the methodology set out within the WSI (CA 2007). An archaeologist was present during intrusive groundworks comprising the machine excavation of foundations, services trenches and ground reduction (Fig. 2).
- 1.8 Where archaeological deposits were encountered written, graphic and photographic records were compiled in accordance with CA Technical Manual 1: *Fieldwork Recording Manual* (2007).
- 1.9 The archive from the evaluation is currently held by CA at their offices in Kemble and will be deposited with the Oxfordshire Museums Service. A summary of information from this project, set out within Appendix B, will be entered onto the OASIS online database of archaeological projects in Britain.

2. RESULTS

- 2.1 The natural geological substrate 003 comprised green clay, was revealed across the footprint of the extension and was encountered at an average depth of 0.7m below present ground level (bpgl). This was overlain throughout by a 0.5m thick levelling deposit comprising modern building material, 002, for the modern concrete surface, 001.
- 2.2 No features or deposits of archaeological interest were observed during groundworks and, despite visual scanning of spoil, no artefactual material pre-dating the modern period was recovered.

3. DISCUSSION

3.1 Despite the archaeological potential of the area, the watching brief identified no archaeological remains within the area of observed groundworks. The absence of topsoil and subsoil deposits may indicate that any archaeological features may have been truncated during previous development.
