SUMMARY

An archaeological watching brief was undertaken by Cotswold Archaeology during groundworks associated with the installation of new drainage and other services within the Tower base and across the churchyard to the west of All Saints Church, Sutton Benger, Wiltshire.

No features or deposits of archaeological interest were observed during groundworks, and no artefactual material pre-dating the modern period was recovered.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 In January 2010 Cotswold Archaeology (CA) carried out an archaeological watching brief for Andrew Townsend Architects (ATA) on behalf of Sutton Benger Parochial Church Council (PCC) at All Saints Church, Sutton Benger, Wiltshire (centred on NGR: ST 9472 7872; Fig. 1).
- 1.2 The archaeological watching brief was undertaken to monitor any disturbance of deposits within the Tower base and across the churchyard to the west. The objective of the watching brief was to record all archaeological remains exposed during the groundworks.
- 1.3 The watching brief was carried out in accordance with the *Brief for Archaeological Consultant* (ATA 2009), and with a subsequent detailed Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) produced by CA (2009). The fieldwork also followed the *Standard and Guidance for an Archaeological Watching Brief* (IfA 2008), the *Standards for Archaeological Assessment and Field Evaluation in Wiltshire* (Wiltshire County Council 1995), the *Management of Archaeological Projects* (English Heritage 1991), the *Guidance for best practice for treatment of human remains excavated from Christian burial grounds in England* (English Heritage 2005) and the *Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (MoRPHE)* (English Heritage 2006).

The site

- 1.4 All Saints Church is located at the centre of the small village of Sutton Benger. (Fig.2). The site, approximately 0.16 ha in area, lies at approximately 55m AOD.
- 1.5 The underlying solid geology of the area is mapped as Oxford Clay of the Upper Jurassic period. This is overlain by drift geology First Terrace gravel of the Pleistocene and recent era (BGS 1965). The groundworks revealed a layer of buried graveyard soil but did not intrude on either the solid geology or drift geology of the area.

Archaeological background

1.6 The Grade II* listed All Saints Church is constructed in rubble stone with stone slate roofs and coped gables. The main body of the church dates to the 14th to 15th centuries (with 12th century origins) and was heavily restored in 1851 by J. H. Hakewill (EH 2010).

Methodology

- 1.7 The fieldwork followed the methodology set out within the WSI (CA 2009). An archaeologist was present during intrusive groundworks associated with the installation of new drainage and other services. (Fig. 2).
- 1.8 No Archaeological deposits were uncovered during the groundworks.
- 1.9 The archive from the watching brief is currently held by CA at their offices in Kemble. Subject to the agreement of the legal landowner, the archive will be deposited with Wiltshire Heritage Museum, Devizes. A summary of information from this project, set out within Appendix B will be entered onto the OASIS online database of archaeological projects in Britain.

2. RESULTS

2.1 No features or deposits of archaeological interest were observed during groundworks and, despite visual scanning of spoil, no artefactual material pre-dating the modern period was recovered.

3. DISCUSSION

3.1 Despite the archaeological potential of the application area (see archaeological background above) the watching brief identified no archaeological remains within the area of observed groundworks. The absence of archaeological deposits may indicate that structural remains associated with the church either do not extend as far as or were not exposed by the development.
