NORTH WEST**

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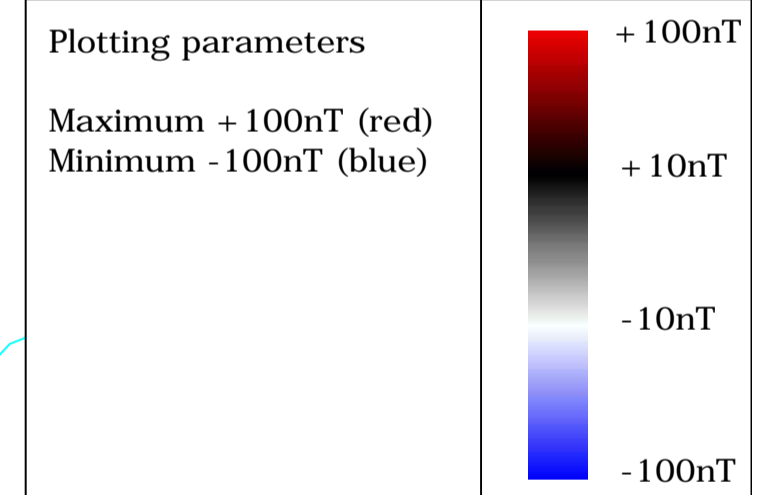

SOUTH**

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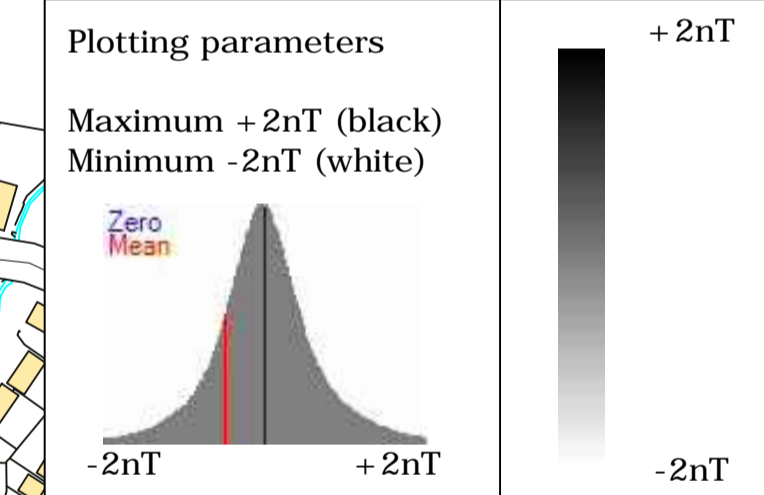

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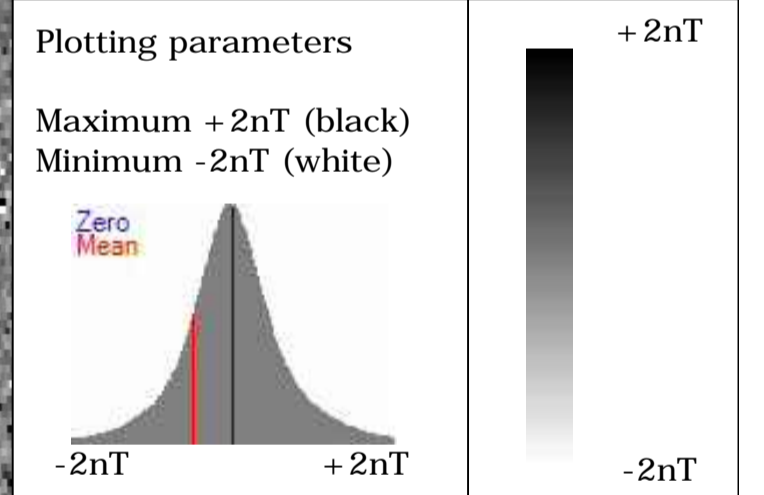

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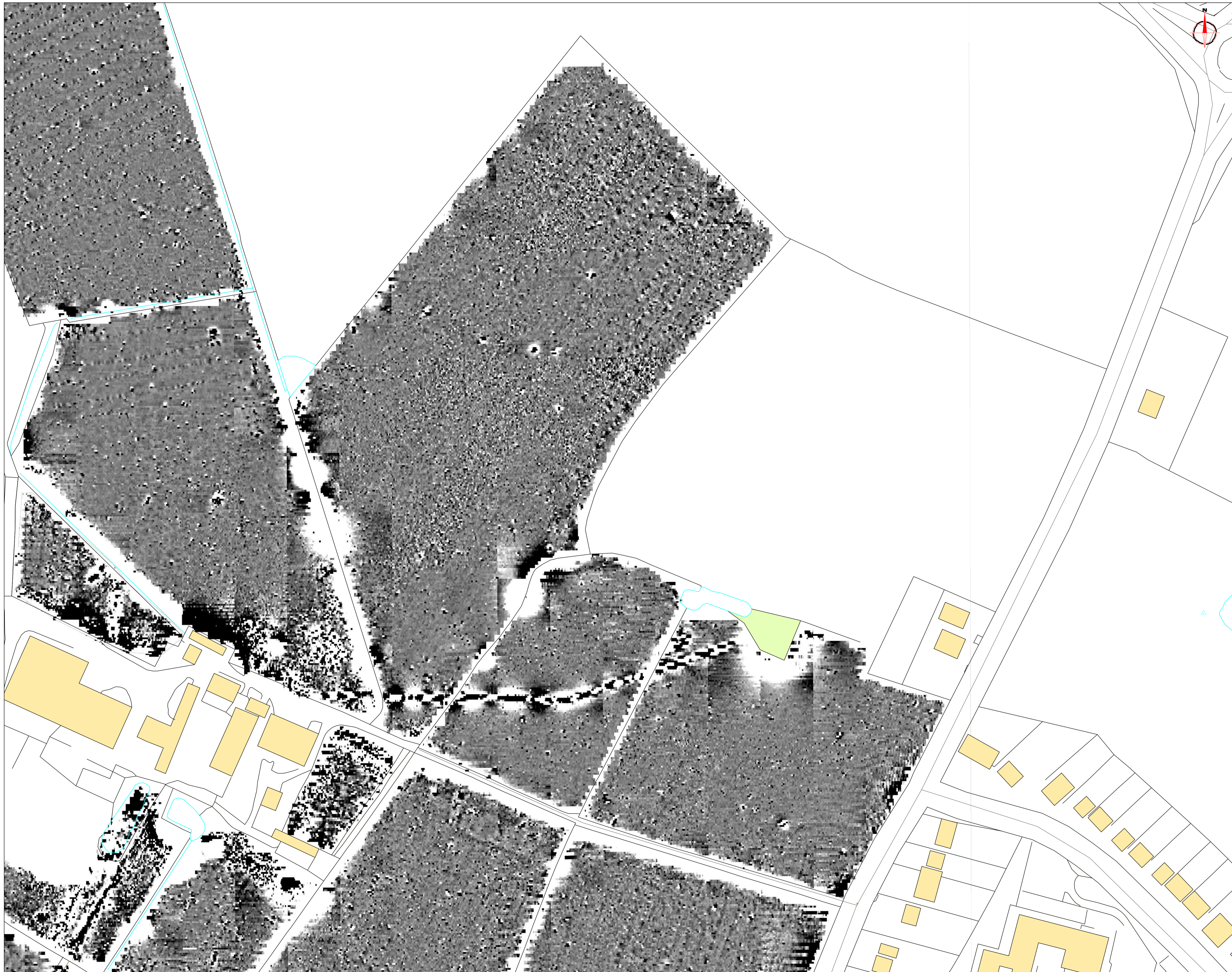

DATA - NORTH WEST**

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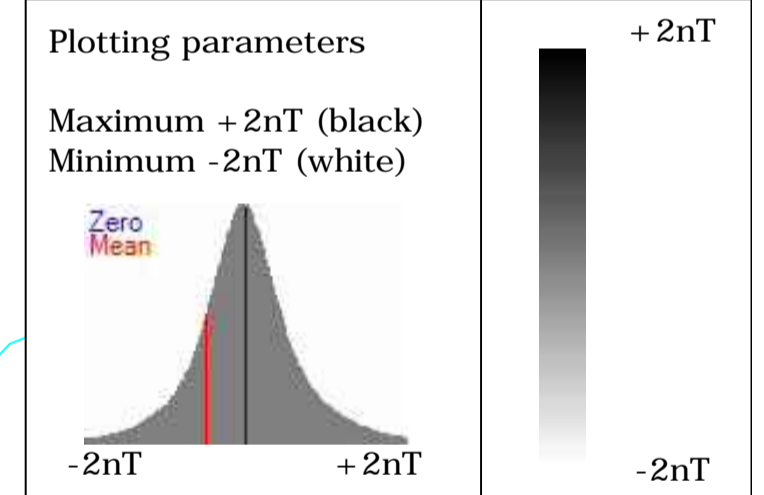

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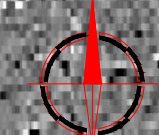

DATA - NORTH EAST**

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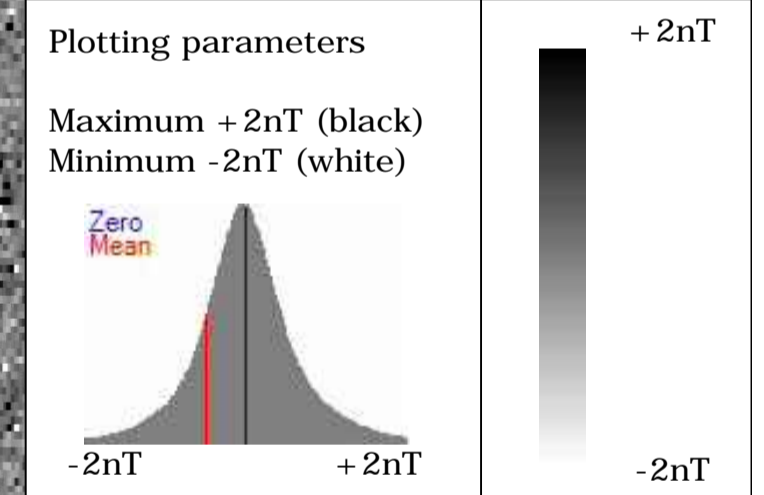
