#### 1. INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 General

This report presents the results of a archaeological evaluation undertaken by CFA Archaeology Ltd (CFA) on the 5<sup>th</sup> December 2012 at lauder Primary School, 2 Crofts Road, Lauder, Scottish Borders (NGR: NT 53028 47468, Fig. 1). The work was commissioned by Eildon Housing Association Ltd.

A Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) dated 14<sup>th</sup> May 2012 was produced by CFA and agreed by Dr Christopher Bowles, Scottish Borders Council Archaeologist.

#### 1.2 Background

Planning permission (11/01337/FUL) for housing has been granted for the construction of new housing at Lauder Primary School, 2 Crofts Road, Lauder.

There is an indication that Lauder was a medieval walled town, and that the defensive wall extended underneath the site of Lauder Primary School. This is indicated by the configuration of Crofts Road which is at least 18<sup>th</sup> century, but likely an older feature of the town. Due to the archaeologically sensitive nature of the area and the possible presence of a medieval town wall in this location, a programme of archaeological works was attached to the consent.

### 1.3 Objectives

The project's aims and objectives were:

- To establish the presence/absence, extent, condition, character, quality and date of any archaeological features or deposits within the proposed development area through trial trenching evaluation;
- To establish the vulnerability of any archaeological features to the proposed development;
- To propose mitigation measures.

#### 2. WORKING METHODS

#### 2.1 General

CFA Archaeology Ltd follows the Institute for Archaeologists' Code of Conduct, Standards and Guidance for Archaeological Watching Briefs.

#### 2.2 Archaeological Evaluation

Three trial trenches were excavated and this was done to a strategy agreed with the Scottish Borders Council Archaeology Officer. The trenches covered 6% (150m²) of the development site (0.25ha).

All trenches were excavated by machine under direct archaeological supervision to remove topsoil and modern deposits down to subsoil or the first significant archaeological horizon, whichever was reached first. Any further excavation required to fulfil the objectives of the evaluation was carried out by hand.

The stratification of all excavated areas was recorded, whether or not significant archaeological deposits have been identified.

The locations of all trenches was recorded using industry standard electronic surveying equipment.

Trenches were backfilled on completion of excavation.

#### 3. ARCHAEOLOGICAL RESULTS

Three trenches were excavated during the evaluation (Fig. 1). The numbers in bold and parentheses refer to contexts (Appendix 1). No archaeological deposits or artefacts were found.

Trench 1






Fig.2 - Trench 1, looking north

Trench 1 was aligned north-south and measured 17 long, 3m wide and 0.55m deep (Fig. 2). The stratigraphy consisted of 0.5m of demolition rubble (001) directly overlying natural gravel (000).

Trench 2

Trench 2 was aligned north-south and measured 17 long, 3m wide and 0.6m deep (Fig. 3). The stratigraphy consisted of 0.6m of demolition rubble (**001**) directly overlying natural gravel (**000**).

Trench 3

Trench 3 was aligned north-south and measured 16 long, 3m wide and 0.5m deep (Fig. 4). The stratigraphy consisted of 0.4m of demolition rubble (001) directly overlying natural gravel (000).

#### 4. CONCLUSION

The evaluation comprised of three trenches covering 150m<sup>2</sup>. These were positioned in order to focus upon the area most likely to contain any evidence for the existence of a medieval town wall. The evaluation showed that the area here had been completely scarped during the building of the school and its subsequent demolition.

No archaeological deposits or artefacts were found during the evaluation.

A summary statement of the results of this evaluation will submitted for publication in *Discovery and Excavation in Scotland* (Appendix 3).

The project archive, comprising all CFA record sheets, maps and reports, will be deposited with the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historic Monuments of Scotland (RCAHMS) and copies of reports will be lodged with the Scottish Borders Council Sites and Monuments Record.
