1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 General

This report describes the results of an Archaeological Monitored Strip required during groundbreaking associated with the construction of a new extension at 6 Old Church Lane, Duddingston, Edinburgh (Ref: 13/00782/FUL) (Fig. 1, Plates 1-2). The work was carried out to comply with a Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) produced by CFA Archaeology Ltd and agreed in advance with the City of Edinburgh Council Archaeology Service (CECAS) on behalf of the planning authority. The work was commissioned by Helen Lucas Architects *per* Mrs Jaquetta Megarry & Mr Keir Bloomer

The new extension was built to replace an exiting one that occupied a similar footprint. The Monitored Strip was required because the development lay within the proposed confines of the medieval settlement of Duddingston and by extension significant features relating to the medieval settlement could have survived within the confines of the development footprint.

1.2. Objectives

The objectives of the project were to conduct an appropriate programme of archaeological investigation (Monitored Strip) during the excavation of all groundbreaking works associated with the construction of the extension, any other groundbreaking associated with the application such as the removal of foundations during demolition.

2. WORKING METHODS

2.1 General

CFA Archaeology Ltd follows the Institute for Archaeologists' Code of Conduct, Standards and Guidance for Archaeological Fieldwork. Recording of all elements followed established CFA methods, as detailed in the approved WSI.

2.2 Monitored Strip

The terms of the WSI required an appropriate programme of archaeological investigation (Monitored Strip) to monitor ground breaking works (Plates 3-4). Excavation was undertaken by hand.

The ground breaking works consisted of the removal of an existing concrete slab foundation for the previous extension that was present on the site. This was followed by limited ground reduction and the excavation of strip foundations and drainage tracks

3. ARCHAEOLOGICAL RESULTS

The concrete slab foundation of the earlier extension lay over a bed of sand over a damp proof course. This was removed to expose what was presumably garden soil. This was a black silty clay.c. 0.35m deep. Where foundation trenches and drainage trenches were excavated through this it was observed to overlie a compact mid brownish clay subsoil. Natural deposits were not exposed in the excavations necessary to construct this extension.

No finds were retained as they were all 19th century or later in date.

4. CONCLUSION

The site was not stripped as excavation was restricted to removal of recent structures, concrete surfaces, localised ground reduction and foundation and drainage trenches. At no point were natural deposits uncovered. Therefore no archaeologically significant remains were found during these works and no significant artefacts were identified either.

No further work is recommended, however, it is understood that the final decision on this rests with CECAS on behalf of the planning authority.

The project archive, comprising all CFA record sheets, plans and reports will be deposited with the National Monuments Record of Scotland and copies of reports lodged with the CECAS.

A summary statement of the results of this watching brief will be submitted for publication in *Discovery and Excavation in Scotland* (Appendix 3).






Plate 1 – General dvelopment area mid demolition
