

#### 1 Summary

Archaeological monitoring was carried out at Mount Stores, The Street, Pleshey, Essex during excavations for the installation of an underground LPG tank. Despite being located in an archaeologically-sensitive area, no significant archaeological deposits or material were observed during this work.

#### 2 Introduction (Fig 1)

This is the archive report for archaeological monitoring at Mount Stores, The Street, Pleshey, Essex which was carried out on 28th February 2020. The work was commissioned by Andrew Stevenson Associates on behalf of Mr & Mrs Gibb and comprised the excavation of a trench for an underground LPG tank. The work was undertaken by Colchester Archaeological Trust (CAT).

In response to consultation with Essex County Council Place Services (ECCPS), Historic Environment Advisor Alison Bennett advised that in order to establish the archaeological implications of this application, the applicant should be required to commission a scheme of archaeological investigation in accordance with the *National Planning Policy Framework* (MHCLG 2019).

Due to time constraints and the limited scope of the works all archaeological work was carried out in accordance with verbal instructions from Alison Bennett and without written scheme of investigation (WSI). All work was, however, carried out in accordance to standard monitoring practices.

All fieldwork and reporting was done in accordance with English Heritage's Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (MoRPHE) (English Heritage 2006), and with Standards for field archaeology in the East of England (EAA 14 and 24). This report mirrors standards and practices contained in the Institute for Archaeologists' Standard and guidance for archaeological field excavation (CIfA 2014a) and Standard and guidance for the collection, documentation, conservation and research of archaeological materials (CIfA 2014b).

#### 3 Archaeological background

The following archaeological background draws on the Essex Historic Environment Record (EHER) held at Essex County Council, County Hall, Chelmsford, Essex (accessible to the public via <a href="http://www.heritagegateway.org.uk">http://www.heritagegateway.org.uk</a>.

The site is located in the garden of Mount Stores, a Grade II listed 18th-century timber-framed and plastered house, part of which was in use as a shop in the 20th century, hence the name (NHLE 1265041). The property is located immediately to the north-west of the adjacent to the enclosure earthwork of the scheduled area of Pleshey Castle and town enclosure (SM EX22 HA 1002191 EHER 1126). Pleshey Castle is a good example of a motte and bailey type of earthwork built in the 12th century with an unusually well-preserved town enclosure. The castle was slighted in 1157-8 but refortified in 1167. Only a short length of the north bailey remains, its line possibly marked by Back Lane. As the site lies within the medieval town enclosure, there is a high potential for archaeological finds and features relating to the medieval and post-medieval settlement.

#### 4 Aim

Archaeological monitoring was undertaken to record any archaeological deposits which would have been disturbed by the groundworks.

#### **5 Results** (Figs 2-3)

On 28th February 2020 in heavy rain, a CAT archaeologist monitored the excavation of a 3.9m by 1.8m rectangular trench for an underground LPG tank.

After the turf was removed two layers were recorded. A 0.42m thick layer of sandy silt topsoil (L1) overlay a natural layer of silty clay (L2). L1 contained peg tile, modern bottle glass and white china. L2 was removed across the trench to a depth of 0.05m in order to confirm that was indeed natural geology and not an archaeological deposit. As the composition of L2 remained consistent and was devoid of artefacts it was concluded that this was natural and that further excavation under archaeological supervision was not necessary.

#### 6 Finds

Peg tile fragments, modern bottle glass and white china were observed within L1 but were not retained for post-excavation analysis.

#### 7 Discussion

Groundworks at this site revealed no significant archaeological contexts.



Fig 1 Site location.






Fig 3 Representative section.




