Part 6: The coarse wares: fabric and form series

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Fabrics

This list is a revision of the original fabric type series, using the abbreviations of the National Fabric Collection where possible (Tomber and Dore 1998). Where the source of a fabric is unknown, the description has been taken from the original report, although the original fabric numbering system has not been retained. The list includes the more common fabrics types from the site in the areas selected for re-cataloguing, along with some of the more unusual fabrics of interest from all the sites. It does not include minor fabrics in detail, most of which have been left as 'unidentified wares'.

Fine wares

Nene Valley colour-coated ware (NVCC). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 118.

North Gaulish fabric 2. See Anderson 1980, 33.

Cologne colour-coated ware (KOL CC). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 57.

Central Gaulish black-slipped ware (CNG BS). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 50.

Moselkeramik black-slipped ware (MOS BS). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 60.

Other fine wares of interest

Central Gaulish glazed ware

Date: c. 43 – 70 (Greene 1979, 99). A single sherd with barbotine dot decoration was recovered from the villa site. The ware has been found locally at York and Malton (*ibid.*, fig. 39).

Spanish colour-coated ware (SPA CC). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 65.

Date: c. 40 - 80. A single sherd was recovered from the villa site.

Oxford red-slipped ware (OXF RS). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 176.

A small number of vessels only.

Coarse wares

Kiln fabric (see also the mortarium report)

The main fabric is hard with plentiful, fine rounded quartz inclusions visible under magnification, occasionally up to 1mm across, and less common red and black inclusions; the proportions of these three inclusions varies. Of particular notice, however, are the occasional silver mica plates. The pottery sherds in the kiln, being waste material,

included both under and over-fired vessels and a range of colour variations, but the desired colour and fabric were a hard mid-grey and orange.

The clay used for flagons was slightly different, a fine orange fabric with rounded white and occasionally pink quartz inclusions visible under magnification. There are more black and red and less quartz inclusions than in the fabric used for other vessel forms, but fewer inclusions overall. It usually has a thick cream slip.

Ebor ware

Fabrics 1 and 2

Ebor grey

Date: 70 – early third century See Mongahan 1997, 869.

Swan identifies a lid-seated jar as possibly being Ebor grey ware (type series no. 615; Swan 1992, 25, M).

Red-painted. See Monaghan 1997, 877-80.

Date: Hadrianic-Antonine.

Approximately six vessels, one from inside the fort and the rest from the *vicus* north of the river.

Late Ebor ware (North African style)

Date: early third century.

Although sherds from about 20 North African style head pots have been recovered from the sites, there is only a single utilitarian vessel in this ware, a lid from the fort baths (type series no. 681; Swan 1992, fig. 4, no. 73).

Black burnished ware fabric 1 (DOR BB 1)

Date: Hadrianic to fourth century in north-east England

Black burnished ware fabric 2 (BB2)

Date: from mid-second century, but mainly third century. See Bidwell and Croom 2002, 153, 169.

This appears in modest quantities, and consists almost exclusively of bowls and dishes.

South Essex/North Kent

Date: mostly third century.

Wares related to the BB2 industries. There is a smaller amount of South Essex/North Kent type fabrics than BB2, in the form of cooking pots.

'Native' (local traditional)

Some sherds had previously been removed and have been studied separately (see native pottery report). A few extra sherds were discovered during re-cataloguing. As pottery made by local traditional methods is often found in small quantities on military sites in the north (Bidwell and Croom 2002, 169-70), unless a vessel form is clearly Anglo-Saxon, all undiagnostic body sherds have been listed under this category.

Dales ware (DAL SH). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 157.

Date: mid-third – fourth century.

Yorkshire grey wares

Date: third century

There are examples of pottery from Norton (c.220 - 280), and Throlam (mid- or late third century to mid-fourth century), and probably others from the other sites of the Holme-on-Spalding-Moor industries.

Brown margin grey ware

Date: third century

Very hard, gritty mid-grey fabric with blue-grey burnished surface, brown margins and grey core. Probably related to gritty grey ware, but does not have the full range of jar rim forms of that fabric.

Gritty grey ware

Date: late third century – fourth century

Hard, mid-grey fabric with common to abundant, large quartz inclusions. Typically found as cooking pots with everted rims that are flat-topped, cupped or double lid-seated. The vessels were both wheel-thrown, and hand-thrown with the rim finished on a slow wheel.

Late handmade (fabric B18). See Mongahan 1997, 911.

Date: late fourth century.

Calcite-gritted ware (CG). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 201

Date: small quantities from late third century, mainly fourth century

The National Fabric Reference Collection abbreviation HUN CG is not used in order to avoid confusion, as the ware includes non-Huntcliff-type vessels. The term 'Huntcliff' is only used in this pottery report in regards to the 'Huntcliff-type' rim, with a groove on the inner face (dated 360+). In the site narratives the term is used more generally to mean any late calcite-gritted ware.

Crambeck reduced ware (CRA RE),

Crambeck parchment ware (CRA PA),

Crambeck red ware (CRA red). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 196.

Date: reduced ware from c.270, parchment ware from c.370 (Bidwell 2005); red ware fourth-century.

Minor wares of interest

Pompeian-red ware

A single sherd was recovered from the *vicus* north of the river. Burnt, but possibly Peacock 1977a, Fabric 3.

Savernake ware. See Tomber and Dore 1998, 191.

Date: Early first century to early or mid-second century, with Lydiard Tregose kilns possibly continuing into the third or fourth centuries.

Sherds from a single storage jar with burnished decoration were found in the southern vicus. This ware usually has a limited distribution in and around Wiltshire so it is unusual to find even a single vessel this far north (Tyers 1996, 195).

Severn Valley ware (SVW OX). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 148-9.

Date: mainly second century in the north.

Although this ware has a mainly western distribution, storage vessels in particular are found in small numbers on sites in north-east England and Scotland.

North Gaulish grey ware (NOG RE). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 74.

Date: first to third century.

Only a couple of sherds from *vases triconique* have been found from the bath-house (TV78 AN) and the area of *vicus* building 1 (HS80, AGC).

Horningsea (HOR RE). See Tomber and Dore 1998, 116.

Date: mainly second and third century

The full range of vessel types have a local distribution in the Fenland area, but small quantities of storage jars have been found on the northern frontier (Bidwell and Croom 2002, 153). As with Savernake ware, the storage jars are found further away than other kiln types, suggesting that the wares themselves were not being traded but that the jars were useful containers for some other commodity that needed to be transported round the country.

Shell-gritted

Evans has identified some Southern shell-tempered ware from the ditches, but this was not in the re-catalogued material (Evans 1996b, 77).

Parisian ware

Date: late first to third century

A small number of sherds in at least three different fabrics, with stamped decoration, including roundels, rosettes and squares.

Painted wares

The sites produced a variety of painted orange and cream wares from a number of sources. There is also a large cornice-rimmed beaker in a self-coloured buff fabric, with a painted human figure (type series no. 667, pl. no. 00). Too little of the figure survives for certain identification, but it may possibly be an image of Vulcan (cf Webster 1989, fig, 6).

Lower Tyne Valley Painted oxidised

Hard orange fabric often with a grey core or interior and burnished surfaces. Small common inclusions of angular quartz and occasional small soft orange and hard grey inclusions, fragments of sandstone and some mica can be present. This ware is often seen

with white painted decoration of dots and scroll-like motifs. This fabric has been recorded at South Shields and Carlisle, with forms including jars and flagons. A production site in the lower Tyne region is proposed.

Type Series

L. Hird

The entries include fabric descriptions, site code and original context number, and its general location (one of four: fort and ditches, the *vicus* north of the river, the *vicus* south of the river, and the villa), occasionally followed by a more precise location. Apart from at the beginning and end, where vessels of unidentified fabric are considered together, the series is divided up according to fabric type.




Fig. D9.38. Coarse pottery type series nos. 1-24. Scale 1:4




Fig. D9.39. Coarse pottery type series nos. 25-52. Scale 1:4




Fig. D9.40. Coarse pottery type series nos. 53-78. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.41. Coarse pottery type series nos. 79-102. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.42. Coarse pottery type series nos. 103—122. Scale 1:4 unless otherwise stated




Fig. D9.43. Coarse pottery type series nos. 123—145. Scale 1:4




Fig. D9.44. Coarse pottery type series nos. 146-166. Scale 1:4




Fig. D9.45. Coarse pottery type series nos. 167-185. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.46. Coarse pottery type series nos. 186-206.




Fig. D9.47. Coarse pottery type series nos. 207-219




Fig. D9.48. Coarse pottery type series nos. 220-238. Scale 1:4




Fig. D9.49. Coarse pottery type series nos. 239-254. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.50. Coarse pottery type series nos. 255-276. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.51. Coarse pottery type series nos. 277-296. Scale 1:4 unless otherwise stated




Fig. D9.52. Coarse pottery type series nos. 297-324. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9-52. Coarse pottery type series nos. 325-355. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.54. Coarse pottery type series nos. 356-377. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.55. Coarse pottery type series nos. 378-396. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.56. Coarse pottery type series nos. 397-423. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.57. Coarse pottery type series nos. 424-438. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.58. Coarse pottery type series nos. 439-467. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.59. Coarse pottery type series nos. 468—490. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.60. Coarse pottery type series nos. 491-514. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.61. Coarse pottery type series nos. 515-533. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.62. Coarse pottery type series nos. 534-554. Scale 1:4




Fig. D9.63. Coarse pottery type series nos. 555-579. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.64. Coarse pottery type series 580-602. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.65. Coarse pottery type series 603-631. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.66. Coarse pottery type series nos. 632-654. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.67. Coarse pottery type series nos. 655-682. Scale 1:4.




Fig. D9.68. coarse pottery type series nos. 683-696. Scale 1:4.
