Description of works.

Introduction

An archaeological watching brief was undertaken during groundworks associated with the construction of Phase II of a hybrid planning application for mixed use development on land at Milizac Close, Yealmpton, Devon (Fig 1). The investigations were required by South Hams District Council as a condition of the grant of planning permission, and were carried out in accordance with a Written Scheme of Investigation prepared by AC archaeology.

The development area lies on the western outskirts of Yealmpton on what is currently agricultural land. It occupies an area of about 6 ha, with the underlying solid geology comprising of Middle Devonian Slates.

Phase II of the development is for residential use of up to 45 units with means of access.

Results (Fig. 2)

Groundworks comprised of the excavation of the foundation trenches (Plates 1 and 2). The external foundation trenches measured 0.90m wide and the internal trenches measured 0.70m wide. They were dug to the minimum level of 1m. The southwest corner of the new dwelling is adjacent to an old boundary stone wall and the foundation trench was excavated to a level of 1.8m for 2m along the foundation trench corner.


The following soil sequence was recorded: a topsoil, measuring 0.35m thick, comprising moderate dark greyish brown clayey-silt with occasional brick, occasional small glass, occasional small to medium animal bone, below which was a subsoil, measuring 0.20m thick, consisting of fairly compact mid greyish brown sandy clay with occasional medium sub-rounded stones and occasional small charcoal flecks. The underlying natural consisted of a compact light brown-yellow sandy clay with occasional sub-rounded stone. The topsoil contained an abundance of fragmented clay tobacco pipes.

Summarv

No archaeological features or deposits were encountered. The soil profile consisted of a typical agricultural sequence.
