Description of works.

Introduction

An archaeological watching brief was undertaken during groundworks for a new stair turret at the Grade II Listed 2 Brook Cottages, Netherton (Fig. 1). The works formed part of the restoration of the property, which was damaged by fire on 30 August 2016. The building had been the subject of a full architectural survey (Govier *et. al.* 2017), prepared in support of planning and Listed Building Consent applications for rebuilding. This identified the location of a probable, now removed, stair turret at the rear of the property, which had been replaced by internal staircases.

Results (Plates 1-3)

An area measuring approximately 1m by 4.40m, located adjacent to the north end of the house, was reduced by 0.80m below the current surface (Fig. 2). The following feature and deposits were exposed:

- 100 0.05m deep layer of modern concrete forming the current surface behind the house.
- 102 Natural mid brown-red breccia
- F101 Sewer trench aligned north-south cutting through 102 to a maximum depth of 0.55m, and backfilled with mid brownish-red loose breccia fragments.

Comments

It was clear from the investigations that the ground to the rear of the house has been extensively disturbed in the 20th century, and that no archaeological deposits are present; there was therefore no evidence for the historic stair turret that is thought to have been located here.

Render had been removed from the east elevation of the house confirming the previous observation that the wall was initially constructed using cob. It also exposed stone rebuilds (or refacing) at the north and south ends of the wall. The former incorporated the first-floor window and probably relates to the reconfiguration of openings after the removal of the stair turret. The 'cob band' of the possible stair turret recorded previously was not present as a feature, and appears to have been a thicker layer of modern plaster. The rebuilding to the south probably forms part of a larger, perhaps contemporary or slightly earlier, rebuilding of the south end of the building; previous observations had identified that the south wall at ground-floor level was a stone rebuild.








