### Introduction (Fig. 1; Plate 1)

An archaeological trench evaluation was carried out by AC archaeology in advance of the construction of a new poultry unit on land at Butsford Barton, Colebrooke, Crediton, Devon (SS 7657 0053). The site lies immediately to the northeast of Butsford Barton farm complex, which is situated some 600m to the northwest of Colebrooke and 6km west of Crediton. It comprised part of a wider pasture plot situated on ground that slopes gradually southeast towards Butsford Lane and a watercourse beyond.

The work comprised the machine-excavation of five trial trenches totalling 110m in length, with each trench 1.2m wide. These were positioned to provide a sampled coverage of the proposed development area but avoiding existing services

The site lies in an area containing several cropmark sites interpreted from aerial photographs as representing evidence for possible prehistoric to Romano-British activity. These are located within the field to the northwest of the site and include possible double-ditched D-shaped and rectangular enclosures situated on more elevated ground. To the southwest of these and close to Butsford Barton are further crop mark sites. These comprise a possible oval enclosure and two ring ditches representing potential plough levelled barrows

#### Results (Fig. 1; Plates 2-4)

The trenches were excavated onto natural subsoil, which consisted of a weathered breccia in a dark brownish-red silty-sand matrix. This was exposed at a depth of approximately 0.5m below existing levels and was overlain by a 0.2m thick dark reddish-brown sandy-loam subsoil and a mid reddish-brown silty-loam topsoil.

No archaeological features or deposits were exposed in any of the trenches. A single sherd of Staffordshire White Ware was recovered from the topsoil of Trench 4. This comprised the base of a china teacup, dating to post 1780.

## Comments

The trenches exposed a simple sequence of agricultural soils sealing the weathered breccia geology. No evidence for prehistoric activity relating to the adjacent cropmark sites was exposed by the work.




