

Context One Archaeological Services Ltd (COAS) carried out an Archaeological Watching Brief on behalf of Mr & Mrs Bendle as a condition of granting planning permission for the conversion of an agricultural building into a live/work unit at Gollick Park Farm, Battle Street, Clayhidon, Mid Devon, Devon (see attached plan). In the Brief for Archaeological Monitoring and Recording it was stated that: "The farmhouse at Gollick Park dates to the 17th century, while the earliest documentary reference to the site is in 1566 as 'Gollakecoote'". The archaeological work involved the monitoring of a pipe trench dug across 180 metres of open ground and the excavation of foundations for a new garage.
